Field visits are also undertaken by MSL Chapter members to enable them have a first hand knowledge of field ministry. Chapter members also provide care and hospitality to missionaries.

JANUARY

Fri. Jan. 01: New Year — Happy New Year! Let us appreciate God for His protection and providence in the previous year and the privilege to be counted among the living in this New Year, 2021. Using Psalm 32:8,9, ask God for more clarity on what He would have us do to have greater impact in advancing His Kingdom this year. Also, ask for grace to say NO to sin and remain faithful ambassadors of Christ in all areas.

Sat. Jan. 02: Nigeria — Using Joshua 21:45, pray that all the many good things God has spoken about Nigeria through His prophets would come to pass: That Nigeria is like the trigger of a gun which will trigger last days revival; Nigeria shall yet be one of the safest and greatest nations in the world and that, Nigeria shall yet be a nation where people will queue for her visa to visit the nation because of the transformation and development God will bring to the nation.

Sun. Jan. 03: Botswana — The Twana were the first Bantu people in Africa to respond to the Gospel, sadly, today, majority of them are Christians in name. There is widespread immorality,



drunkenness and a breakdown of the traditional family structure. Therefore, pray for a reversal of the moral decline and for

revival among the Church in Twana. Pray for greater and enduring harvest among the Kalanga, Yeyi, Nambya, San, the Mbukushu and Herero peoples.

Mon. Jan. 04: Western Sahara — Using 2 Peter 3:9, pray for the people in this region who are almost completely devoid of the Gospel; ask God to shine His light in their hearts, enabling them to receive Jesus Christ as Saviour and Lord. Pray especially for the Saharawi people that they would find peace, healing and comfort in Christ and be resettled in their ancestral land.

Tues. Jan. 05: Seychelles — The vast majority of Seychellois claim to be Christian, but evidence of true spiritual transformation seems outweighed by nominalism and superstition. Therefore, pray that the Holy Spirit would bring new life evidenced by repentance and sustained fruit. Also, pray for greater unity in the Church and availability of Scripture and



other resources that would have positive impact on the spiritual life of the nation.

Wed. Jan. 06: Togo — Pray that God would break down walls of enmity between the Guinean and Gur people clusters; empower the Christian community economically and for increase in strong, indigenous congregations and denominations with solid teaching, biblical

worldview and visionary leaders. Also, pray for greater unity in the Church in Togo and for the influence of idolatry, secret societies and false religions to be shattered and their captives released to serve the Living God.

Thurs. Jan. 07: Mozambique — Ask God to show mercy and tame the tide of natural disasters with their resultant hardship and setback. Pray that the Church would grow in maturity and truth that matches growth in numbers without forsaking cultural authenticity. Ask the Lord to raise biblically literate and godly leaders to match the everincreasing needs of the Church. Finally, pray for greater harvests among the



Makhwa, Yao, Mwani , Koti and other unreached peoples.

Fri. Jan. 08: Sao Tome & Principe — The majority of the population are Catholic, but deep-seated African spiritism such as appeasing spirits and ancestors is often of greater importance than honouring God. Therefore, pray for the Holy Spirit to move through the Catholic Church, bringing renewal and spiritual maturity among believers. Also, pray for the sovereignty of Jesus Christ to be clearly demonstrated and for meaningful outreach that will lead to the salvation of the Angolares and the contract labourers.

Sat. Jan. 09: Iraq — Implore God to intervene in the sufferings of Iraqi people, especially women who are often subjected to forced marriage, abduction, honour killing, violence and rape. Pray that Iraq would be transformed through the power of the Gospel; for true freedom of religion and for unity among believers, with a Christcentred front that responds to hatred and persecution with boldness, forgiveness and love. Also, pray for the emergence of viable indigenous churches among the



Yazidi, Bedouin, Shi'a and Sunni Arabs as well as Madan or Marsh Arabs.

Sun. Jan. 10: Bolivia — Pray for peace within and around Bolivia and for wise governance that would bring justice for the poorest Bolivians and the mistreated indigenous peoples. Pray against the influence of paganism and for the Church to wake up to the enemy's ploy so that there will be greater harvest of souls in the land. Pray that the millions of nominal and Christo-pagan Catholics would experience salvation in Christ.

Mon. Jan. 11: Israel — The Jewish mindset towards Christianity is often characterized by animosity, therefore, pray that the Gospel would be understood as a fulfilment of the Jewish heritage, and pray for greater turning of the Jews to Jesus

Christ, their Messiah. Pray for genuine reconciliation between Israeli Jews and Palestinian Arabs and for both sides to find true peace through Jesus the Messiah and be bound in unity that transcends history and ethnic background.



Tues. Jan. 12: Armenia — Praise God for the survival and growth in numbers of committed believers despite frequent harsh oppression. Pray for spiritual regeneration and unity and that Armenian Christians would be witnesses and blessing to the surrounding regions without meaningful access to the Gospel. Pray for abiding fruitfulness from Christian ministries involved in Bible distribution and Christian radio services.

Wed. Jan. 13: Papua New Guinea (PNG)

— Nominalism and pollution of Christianity with spiritism and the occult are sadly widespread. Therefore, ask God to raise leaders in the Church who would find culturally appropriate ways of building biblical worldview to shape the peoples' faith, character and lifestyle. Also, ask God to grant the leadership and peoples of PNG wisdom to establish both a peace that surpasses mere absence of violence and a national identity that transcends immediate ethnic ties.



Thurs. Jan. 14: Samoa — Pray against nominalism, rivalry, pride and the growing influence of Mormonism in the churches. Also, pray for revival in the churches and for unity and harmony between the newer and the more traditional branches of the Church. Also, pray for Samoan missionaries serving around the world and for more support from their home churches.

Fri. Jan. 15: Vanuatu — Different churches have come to different conclusions on how much traditional culture is appropriate to retain, with extremes on both sides. Therefore, pray that ni-Vanuatu believers would be guided rightly on what parts of custom can be redeemed and what parts must be set aside. Also, pray for all false religions to be exposed and for ni-Vanuatu to hold fast to the truth and life in Christ.

Sat. Jan. 16: Tonga — Tonga's rich Christian heritage is a blessing, but it has reached the point of oversaturation as newer groups entice believers to join them. Therefore, pray that Tongan Christians would seek ways to contribute to the Kingdom of God rather than seeking the church that benefits them the most. Also,



pray for unity in the Church and for Tongans abroad to be envisioned to take the Gospel to the world.

Sun. Jan. 17: The Songhai – Koryaboro, Northcentral Nigeria — The Songhai are all Sunni Muslims, a majority of them have not heard a clear presentation of the Gospel. Ask the Lord to strengthen, encourage and protect the few Christ followers among the Songhai and to also save key leaders among them who will in turn proclaim the Gospel to their people. Pray for the emergence of a viable indigenous Church among the Songhai and the completion of the Bible translation in their language.

Mon. Jan. 18: The Puku, Fakanchi, Sokoto State — A number of the Puku have converted to Islam due to Hausa and Fulani influence but most still practice their traditional religion. Using Psalm 124:7, ask the Lord to break every snare holding the people captive; to send more missionaries and grant more fruitfulness to those already serving there. Also, pray for Puku believers to be models of Christlikeness and boldly share the Gospel with their people.



Tues. Jan. 19: Pa'a Afawa, Bauchi State

— Nearly 1 in 5 of the Pa'a have embraced Islam, but most of them still practice their traditional religious beliefs. Pray that the Light of God will shine in the hearts of the Pa'a, liberating them from darkness into His glorious light. Ask the Lord to grant wisdom and favour to the mission agencies reaching the people and for the Pa'a

believers to be shining lights and boldly live as Christian witnesses among their own people.

Wed. Jan. 20: Nggwahyi (Ngwaxi),

Borno State — Islam is the predominant religion among this people group with only 0.20% Evangelicals. Pray that the people would discover the emptiness in a life without Christ and that Jesus Christ be revealed to the Nggwahyi in an irresistible manner, pulling them from darkness into light. Also, pray that the few believers among them would be faithful witnesses of Jesus Christ and for passion to share the Gospel with their kinsmen.

**Thurs. Jan. 21: Lagwan (Kotoko),
Borno/Adamawa States** — This people



group have only 0.05% Evangelicals. Ask the Lord to increase the peoples' hunger for the Truth and that Jesus Christ be revealed to them in their sincere quest. Also, pray for more labourers in this harvest field and that the hearts of the people be softened and become receptive to the Gospel. Pray for the emergence of strong indigenous Church among the people and availability of resources for effective discipleship.

Fri. Jan. 22: Kanembu, — The Kanembu people practice Islam with no known Christian among them. Their sultans and traditional rulers exert tremendous

influence among the people. Therefore, ask God to send messengers of the Gospel to the Kanembu and pray for the revelation of Jesus Christ to their leaders and influential people among them. Pray that the believers the Lord will soon call to Himself would live holy lives that would draw others to faith in Jesus Christ.

Sat. Jan. 23: Idon (Idong), Kaduna State — A majority of the people have never even heard the Gospel, therefore, ask the Lord to send labourers to the Idon people



and prepare their hearts to receive His Word with joy and gladness in line with Psalm 2:12. Ask the Lord to bring forth a vibrant Idon Church; to strengthen, encourage and protect the Idon believers and give them boldness to share Christ with their own people. Also, pray for availability of the Bible and other resources needed for more effective discipleship of the Idon Church.

Sun. Jan. 24: Nigeria Evangelical Missions Association (NEMA) — Pray for safety, greater grace and wisdom for all missionaries serving under NEMA. Pray specifically for NEMA leaders for divine wisdom, knowledge and understanding to chart the course of the mission movement in righteousness for godly transformation in the body of Christ in Nigeria and beyond.



Mon. Jan. 25: MSL Prayer and Mobilization Centre — MSL Prayer and Mobilization Centre is strategic to mission mobilization in all the nations especially in Africa as it would provide an enabling environment for Christian conferences, meetings and prayer forums. Pray that God will grant all the resources required for the project and send faithful workers who will serve God wholeheartedly in the Centre for the advancement of His kingdom on earth.

Tues. Jan. 26: MSL Kenya — Thank God for sustenance and the efforts of MSL team in Kenya. Pray for grace, wisdom and guidance as the team strives to mobilise more Christians and churches in that region to get involved in the Great Commission. Pray that their efforts will yield abiding fruits that would propagate the gospel of Jesus Christ in East Africa and beyond.

Wed. Jan. 27: MSL Board and Council Members — Thank God for His grace upon MSL Board and Council members. Ask that they will be encouraged to stay strong in the Lord and in the power of His might in such times we are in. Pray that the Lord will help them to maintain a balance in their responsibility towards family and ministry;



and for their spouses and children to be equipped to adequately support them and endure in serving the Lord together faithfully.

Thurs. Jan. 28: MSL Staff/Missionaries

— Pray for sound health and safety for all MSL staff and missionaries with their families and for more wisdom, grace, joy and fulfilment in His service. Ask the Lord to send help concerning the perennial need for shelter – payment of house rents for the missionaries to enable them work under a more relaxed atmosphere. Also, pray that the staff and missionaries would walk closely with God, avoiding all forms of distraction.

Fri. Jan. 29: Muslim Background Believers (MBBs)

— Thank God for the zeal and commitment of the MBBs and pray that they remain resolute in their resolve to follow Jesus Christ in spite of the persecution and huge sacrifices they may have to make. Ask God to comfort and send help to those going through travails on account of their faith in Jesus Christ and for restoration for those who may have slacked. Pray that the transformed lives of the MBBs



will serve as powerful witness to their people and eventually draw them to Christ.

Sat. Jan. 30: Mission Mobilisers — The Church is God's instrument to reach the whole world with the Gospel but she can also constitute the greatest hindrance. Therefore, pray for more wisdom and grace as Mission Mobilisers seek to envision and reawaken the Church for more strategic and meaningful involvement in mission. Ask God for open doors to churches and open hearts from the church leaders and the congregations to obey God's call. Also, pray for safety in the numerous travels of Mission Mobilisers.

Sun. Jan. 31: The Universal Church — Thank God for sustaining His Church globally despite all odds. Ask the Lord to purify His Church and for a mighty outpouring of the Holy Spirit that would engender revival expressed in the fear of God, unity, genuine love for one another, holy living and meaningful participation in world evangelisation.



FEBRUARY

Mon. Feb. 01: Nigeria — Thank God for His goodness to the peoples of Nigeria – for the good soil and favourable climate, abundant mineral resources, superb drainage system, human capital and much more. Ask God for visionary and selfless leaders who would harness these resources maximally for the benefit of the citizens and other nations in Africa and beyond.

Tues. Feb. 02: Madagascar — Pray for a new move of the Holy Spirit to reawaken the churches, foster greater unity among leaders and churches and that pride and jealousy would give way to humility and Kingdom consciousness. Also, pray that the churches would continue to grow and be rooted in Scripture. Pray for more fruitful work among the Muslim peoples – the Sakalava, Antemoro and Antankarana as well as ethnic minorities – Muslim Comorians, Gujaratis and Arabs.

Wed. Feb. 03: Lesotho — Ask God to give the leadership creative and sustainable ways to improve the quality of life of the population. Pray for the Holy Spirit to sweep out nominalism and traditionalism



from the churches; raise church leaders who are spirit-filled, versed in the Scriptures and could discern what is right, biblical and appropriate for their own context. Finally, ask God to bless His work among the mountain peoples and that of Scripture Union among the youth.

Thurs. Feb. 04: Tanzania — Pray that the government would be ruthless in uprooting evil and wise in fostering communal and religious harmony in the land. Ask God to raise more evangelists and church planters to reach the remaining less-reached communities with the Gospel. Pray for continued growth, increased maturity and unity between Pentecostal and other Evangelicals, enabling the Church to reach the Muslims and the animists with the Gospel.

Fri. Feb. 05: DR Congo — Ask God to deliver this land from all forms of evil such as occult practices, witchcraft, brutality and the like. Pray for the peace and economic recovery of Congo and that the evil practices of her tragic history would be overcome through repentance and reconciliation. Also, pray that God will raise Christian leaders with spiritual



maturity and moral integrity for ministry both in the Church and in society.

Sat. Feb. 06: Libya — Appreciate God for the increasing number of Libyan believers; pray for renewal in the churches and for greater religious freedom so that more people will hear the Gospel and be able to follow Jesus openly. Pray also for Libyan believers to stand firm in their faith and to find spiritually edifying relationships, including suitable marriage partners in a society where marriage is typically arranged with extended family.

Sun. Feb. 07: Zimbabwe — Ask God to give the political leadership wisdom in handling the issue of land reforms in a just, equitable and beneficial manner and for significant improvement in the nation's economy. Also, pray for unity and purity in the Church and for the churches to find truly Zimbabwean expressions of biblical faith rooted firmly in God's Word. Finally, pray for fruitful work among the less-reached peoples – the Yao, Tonga, Dombe, Kunda and the Tswa peoples.

Mon. Feb. 08: Europe — The loss of confidence in the supreme authority of the



Scriptures and the uniqueness of the Gospel is a tragedy with crippling effects in most areas of life in Europe. Using Luke 1:16-17, pray for a move of the Holy Spirit that would turn the hearts of Europeans back to God, revive the churches and enable the people to build back their lives and society on biblical values. Finally, ask God to raise more church leaders who are Spirit filled and deeply rooted in the word of God.

Tues. Feb. 09: Pacific Region — Secularism, dwindling interest to participate in organized Christianity and the rapid growth of Mormonism, especially in Polynesia are some of the threats to the Church in the Pacific. Let us pray for a reversal of these negative trends and for the Church to place priority and focus on raising disciples. Also, pray for the Church to be revived, envisioned and trained for more effective cross-cultural ministry in the region.

Wed. Feb. 10: The Americas — Thank God for the tremendous impact of the Church in the Americas in advancing the cause of the Gospel and for being a blessing to the world in so many ways. Pray for theological depth and biblical



understanding, a reigniting of the flame of the Spirit and increase in moral purity and sanctification in the churches. Finally, pray for fruitful Gospel witness to the Amerindians, Chinese, Japanese, Romani, Jews and Muslim peoples in the Americas.

Thurs. Feb. 11: Asia — Asia is the birthplace of the Church but is currently home to most of the Least Reached Peoples of the world with amazing religious, ethnic and cultural diversities. Therefore, pray for a move of the Holy Spirit that would break all the barriers, causing massive turning to Christ among the peoples in the region. Also, pray for the unity of the Church and for God's protection, providence and comfort for those being persecuted on account of their faith in Jesus Christ.

Fri. Feb. 12: Arabs — Appreciate God for the increasing number of Arab believers and ask that they remain steadfast and faithful witnesses of the Gospel as they shine like stars among their people. Ask God for more fruitfulness in reaching the Arabs with the Gospel through the internet, Christian media and other strategies and for effective ways and resources for discipling the converts.



Sat. Feb. 13: Kosovo — The majority of Kosovo's population of nearly 1.9 million is Muslim. Pray that the Albanians and the Serbs would recognize Jesus Christ as the Way, the Truth and the Life and to also embrace Him as the Prince of Peace. Also, pray that the small number of Christians would grow in their knowledge of God, faith and perseverance and be shining lights in the midst of darkness and be agents of peace, healing and reconciliation in a society filled with conflict of interest and hatred.

Sun. Feb. 14: Singapore — Pray that Christians would have wisdom to maintain inter-religious harmony without compromising on evangelism and to maintain balance in relation to their work, family and church life. Also, pray for greater synergy between churches and mission agencies. Trust God for the discipling of a new generation with ministry strategies that are relevant, fresh and full of spiritual power and fruitfulness for outreaches to the Malay, Mainland Chinese and migrant workers.



Mon. Feb. 15: Northern Nigeria — Terrorism, banditry and kidnapping are current trends that continue to threaten peace, progress and corporate existence of the people in this part of Nigeria; a situation that has also posed additional barriers to the spread of the Gospel. Therefore, pray for the restoration of peace and stability and for greater receptiveness to the Gospel among the peoples in this region.

Tues. Feb. 16: Omega Project 2 of Four Square Gospel Church, Asokoro — Give thanks to God for the leadership of this church for their selfless service in supporting missions across the board through the Omega 2 Project. Pray for the church to remain united, focused and steadfast in doing God's will and for more wisdom, favour and provision. Ask God to multiply this type of churches in Nigeria.

Wed. Feb. 17: Nigeria Evangelical Missions Association (NEMA) — Pray that God will continue to equip NEMA with quality information and mobilization resources that would in turn equip spiritual leaders, churches and Christians generally for a better walk and work with God. Pray also that the leadership will remain



committed in order for NEMA to meet up with her responsibility as the umbrella body of missions in Nigeria.

Thurs. Feb. 18: GO International — Thank God for what He is using this agency to achieve in the Great Commission mandate. Pray that God's grace, wisdom, discernment and knowledge will always be upon the leadership to keep them faithful and steadfast to God's calling. Pray also that the staff members would find joy, peace and fulfilment in their service unto the Lord.

Pray for their protection and sustenance as they labour in various areas.

Fri. Feb. 19: Cave Missions — Thank God for the resilience and boldness granted to Cave Missions' leadership and missionaries as they continue to labour in the fields despite the high insecurity in several areas they are labouring. Pray for God's favour and divine help for pioneer works, projects and opening of closed mission bases for the work to advance. Ask God to grant their partners enablement to continue to support the work and also bless their families and businesses.



Sat. Feb. 20: Mission Consult — Praise God for His grace upon the leadership and staff of Mission Consult and for His manifest presence as they labour amongst the Mada, Eggon and Fulani tribes in Northcentral Nigeria. Ask God to pull down every satanic stronghold, conquer territorial powers and thwart evil schemes against the work in the various mission fields. Pray for unwavering commitment to kingdom advancement for the leaders, staff members and partners of Mission Consult and ask God to supply all their needs according to His riches in glory.

Sun. Feb. 21: Calvary International Africa — Thank God for the efforts of the Calvary International Africa in fulfilling His mandate. Pray that both the leaders and staff members will remain focused and dedicated in Ministry. Also, pray for God's protection and provision of resources for effective ministry and for tangible fruits in their ministry efforts.

Mon. Feb. 22: Zion World Prayer and Missions — Praise God for the leadership and staff members of this Ministry and for the fruitfulness in their labour among the unreached peoples within and outside



Nigeria. Ask the Lord for grace, wisdom, favour and peace upon the leadership and coordinators of various regions as they strategically engage their mission fields despite the insecurity. Pray for divine health, protection and resources for the missionaries in the mission fields and ask God for fruitfulness in all their efforts towards kingdom advancement.

Tues. Feb. 23: MSL National Office — The MSL National Office is in dire need of staff in critical areas such as Accounts, Media and Publication, Administration and Website Management; there is also need for people who would fund the various operations of the National Office. Therefore, ask the Lord to send labourers in the affected areas and raise more funding partners for the National Office operations.

Wed. Feb. 24: MSL Leadership/Management — Appreciate God for the MSL Leadership and Management for availing themselves for Kingdom service on this platform. Ask the Lord for more wisdom, unity of the Spirit, discernment and total submission to the



leading of the Holy Spirit. Also, ask the Lord for their protection, sound health, blessing upon their homes and businesses and for grace to walk closely with God.

Thurs. Feb. 25: MSL United Kingdom — MSL UK is supporting a strategic work among migrants in the United Kingdom. Pray for open doors among migrants that would lead to their salvation. Pray for greater outcomes from the partnership and for increase in the support they are generating for the work. Ask the Lord to raise more committed believers from different churches in the UK that will support mission work across the globe.

Fri. Feb. 26: MSL Publications — Ask the Holy Spirit to breathe upon the MSL publications and use them to mobilise His Church into strategic and meaningful involvement in mission. Pray for more grace and inspiration for the team working on the publications; ask God to raise people who would sponsor the printing of the materials and for God's people to be disciplined enough to studiously read, assimilate the message and respond appropriately.



Sat. Feb. 27: Youths Globally — Youths represent the future of the Church in the nations, therefore, pray that the youths would build their lives upon the Rock (Jesus Christ), embrace sound biblical principles and precepts and grow in Christlikeness. Ask God to enable them escape all snares on their path and liberate those entrapped under the yoke of drugs, substance abuse, immoral habits and all forms of false religions and ideologies.

Sun. Feb. 28: Ministers of the Gospel — Using Ezra 7:10, pray for God's grace and open heavens upon all heralds of the Gospel to faithfully proclaim His message in word and deed. Also, ask God for courage, protection, selflessness, wisdom, perseverance and fruitfulness in their labours. As leaders, pray for unity, genuine love and synergy among them and the organisations they represent for greater impact in the furtherance of the Gospel.

MARCH

Mon. March 01: Nigeria — Pray for a new Nigeria! Using Nehemiah 5:1-18, ask the Lord to touch the hearts of Nigerians in a



manner that would result to national repentance and a turning away from vanity, corruption, wickedness and nepotism to embrace peace, unity, brotherhood, justice and equity. Ask God to divinely and progressively work through the process that would lead to the birth of a new Nigeria.

Tues. March 02: Niger Republic— Thank God that Niger Republic has remained open to Christian mission work. Pray that the country will remain open and that every social, religious and spiritual barrier to the knowledge of Jesus Christ would be removed. Ask the Holy Spirit to encourage the believers who are isolated, foster greater unity in the Church, give the right strategies and provide the resources – human, financial and material needed for effective ministry. Finally, pray for greater and lasting impact of Christian ministries to the young people.

Wed. March 03: Malawi — Praise God for the peace that allows Christian ministry and national development to continue unhindered in Malawi. Ask the Lord to neutralize the influence of false religions and for the equipping of the Church for loving, fruitful witness to the Muslim



peoples. Also, pray for revival, unity and greater cooperation among the churches for the furtherance of the Gospel. Ask for the salvation of the Yawo people.

Thurs. March 04: Central African

Republic — Pray for peace, reconciliation, economic recovery and the emergence of Christian business people who would be agents of transformation in economic and spiritual spheres. Ask God to raise more workers, provide for and bless the labours of ministries reaching out to children and youths, enabling them to raise a generation of well-disciplined Christians. Also, pray for mass movement of people to faith in Christ among the Sara Kaba and the Gula/Kara peoples.

Fri. March 05: Ghana — Pray for the liberation of millions of people who attend church and call themselves Christians but whose worldviews and values reflect more of traditional animist beliefs than biblical truth. Also, pray for more spiritually mature leaders in the churches, for the conversion and discipling of a new generation of Christians who will make impact in the religious, political and economic life of Ghana. Ask the Holy Spirit to illuminate the



hearts of Muslims and turn many of them to Christ.

Sat. March 06: Equatorial Guinea — Pray that the 85% who claim Christianity without being born again would hear and respond to the gospel of Jesus Christ; that the laity would grow in their faith and move from nominal Catholic/animistic worldview to a biblical one. Also, pray for more Spirit-filled and godly leaders and the emergence of vibrant indigenous churches among the Fang, Hausa, Ngmba, Benga and Fa D'Ambu peoples.

Sun. March 07: Mauritius — Pray for a greater spiritual vitality among the traditional churches and for wisdom for the Church to present the Gospel in this multicultural context in a powerful and convincing manner. Also, pray that Mauritius would receive more teachers of the Word who are well-trained models of Christian witness. Finally, ask God to reveal Himself to the Muslim, Hindi, Bhojpuri and Urdu peoples supernaturally.

Mon. March 08: Chad — Chad is one of the few Muslim-majority countries where the government is truly secular in



operations; pray for this to continue and that Christians would maximally utilize the opportunities that abound to spread the Gospel. Pray for Christians in Chad to be united and burdened for the salvation of their Muslim countrymen and for the Christians to be equipped to reach out to them effectively. Pray for the Saharan, Guera-Naba, Ouaddai-Fur, Mbororo Fulbe, Shuwa Arabs and other Least Reached Peoples in Chad.

Tues. March 09: Indonesia — Ask God to heal victims of communal violence and religious persecution especially Christians from Maluku and central Sulawesi as they deal with personal loss, bitter trauma and the loss of their ancestral homelands. Also, ask God to frustrate the evil forces working against the growth of the Church in the land – occult powers and false religions. Pray for greater unity and impact of the Church in the society and for more openness of the Muslims to the Gospel.

Wed. March 10: Azerbaijan — Pray for stability and a genuine will to make peace in and around Azerbaijan, for a strong Church with an effective witness to non-Christians especially the majority Muslim



population and that the Church would be truly indigenous yet biblical. Finally, pray for the abolition of laws restricting religious groups, who teach children, produce literature and involvement of foreigners or development of property for religious purposes.

Thurs. March 11: Macau, China —

Macau was 95% Christian (Roman Catholic) in 1600, however, by 2010, this had declined to about 3.1%, a monumental decline. Therefore, pray for revival, the multiplication of Bible-based churches and for believers to win back this territory for the Saviour through evangelism and their exemplary lives. Also, pray for the salvation of Casino workers and those held captive in prostitution and drug abuse.

Fri. March 12: Finland —

Generally speaking, the Church in Finland faces stagnation and decline so, pray for a revival that will cause the Finns, especially men, to earnestly seek God, return to biblical values and regain their twin heritage of sending missionaries and prophetic role in the society. Also, pray for more workers and support for the ministries focusing on youths and that the foreigners in Finland



would experience life-transforming encounter with Jesus Christ.

Sat. March 13: Malta — Malta's proximity to North Africa presents golden opportunity to witness the Gospel to nations such as Libya and Tunisia, therefore, pray for revival in the Church in Malta and for her to be envisioned and empowered to maximise this opportunity. Pray that the Roman Catholic members would have a living relationship with Jesus Christ and for the Catholic Charismatic groups to have maximum impact while retaining biblical faithfulness.

Sun. March 14: Bosnia & Herzegovina — The wounds inflicted by repeated circles of violence are deep and true reconciliation and unity can only be made possible by the Prince of Peace. Therefore, pray for a powerful move of the Holy Spirit to unite the Church, open the hearts of the people to the Gospel and bring transformation in the land in all areas. Also, pray for fruitful ministry among the Bosnian, Romani and the wholly Muslim Turks.

Mon. March 15: Ukraine — Praise God for the dynamic and visionary Ukrainian



mission agencies ministering both at home and in the former Soviet Union. Pray for righteousness, justice and compassion to permeate this nation and for the Church to epitomise unity and reconciliation. Also, pray for fruitful ministry to the numerous cultic groups in the nation and for greater responsiveness to the Gospel among students, Ukrainian Jews and foreign immigrants from unreached backgrounds.

Tues. March 16: Northeast Nigeria — Pray for peace, stability, emotional and economic recovery for multitudes who have been adversely affected by the prolonged activities of insurgence in this region. Ask the Lord to heal hearts that are wounded and hurting particularly the Church community who are the prime targets. Also, ask the Lord to unite and strengthen the Christians in this region and enable them to be agents of peace, beacons of light and faithful witnesses for Christ.

Wed. March 17: Hausa, Northern Nigeria — The Hausa are transnational and the largest ethnic group in the whole of West Africa and very strategic in spreading the Gospel if properly disciplined. Therefore, pray for increased open doors and growth



of matured believers particularly among the Hausas of Northern Nigeria. Ask God to encourage, protect and embolden the few Hausa believers to reach their kinsmen with the Gospel.

Thurs. March 18: Gwandara, Niger, Kaduna States, etc — Pray that the Holy Spirit would prepare the hearts of the Gwandara people, making them receptive to the Gospel. Also, ask God to prosper the work of the mission agencies labouring among them and to reveal Himself to the people through dreams and visions. Also, pray for the availability of the Bible and other resources needed for effective discipling of the Gwandara Church.

Fri. March 19: Kakanda, Niger, Kwara and Kogi States — Using John 8:32, ask the Lord to break the stronghold of false religions and liberate the people from all forms of deception, causing them to embrace the Truth that sets free. Also, ask the Lord to send more harvesters, grant more wisdom and prosper the labours of the mission agencies already working among the Kakanda people.



Sat. March 20: Kaivi (Kaibi), Kaduna State — The Kaivi are mostly ethnoreligious people with only 0.10% Evangelical Christians. Therefore, ask God to send more labourers into this harvest field and soften the hearts of the people, causing them to be more receptive to the Gospel. Pray that the few Christians among them would be shining lights among their people.

Sun. March 21: Sanga (Asanga), Bauchi State — The Sanga people are more than 29,000 in population and are mainly ethnoreligious with 0.5% Christian and 0.00% Evangelical. Pray that God would raise people who would constantly intercede for the Sanga so that God's Kingdom will be revealed among them, for more labourers to be sent into this harvest field and for the emergence of a viable Church among the people.

Mon. March 22: Ukwa, Cross Rivers State — The Ukwa people are mainly ethno-religious with 5.0% who claim to be Christians but only 0.80% are Evangelicals. Pray that many who profess Christ among the Ukwa people will truly know and walk in the fear of God. Pray that the hearts of the



people would be open to accept the Gospel and that the Christians among them would portray Christ-like lives to attract others to faith in Jesus Christ.

Tues. March 23: Guduf, (Gudupe), Borno State — Most of the people have never heard a clear presentation of the Gospel. Therefore, ask the Lord to send more labourers to this harvest field, increase the hunger of the people for the Word of God and open their eyes to perceive and embrace the Truth. Ask the Lord to empower, envision and embolden the few believers among them to reach their own people with the Gospel.

Wed. March 24: Butu-Ningi (Butawa), Bauchi State — The Butu-Ningis, also known as the Butawas are mostly traditional worshippers that value tribal secrets and practice religious traditions handed down from their ancestors. But they have recently begun to accept Islam as their religion. Ask the Lord to send forth committed labourers who understand Butawa culture to work with the people and grant the Butawa believers boldness to share the love of Jesus Christ with their own people.



Thurs. March 25: MSL United States of America (USA) — Thank God for the efforts MSL Chapter members in the USA are making to mobilise believers and raise support for their adopted mission field in Coted'Ivoire. Pray for favour and open doors in churches as they reach out with their mobilization drive. Ask the Lord to strengthen them and meet their families' needs so they remain focused on reaching nations with the gospel through mission support.

Fri. March 26: MSL Mobilisation

Officers — Thank God for the efforts of these Officers in mobilizing the churches in Nigeria for active involvement in mission. Ask God to give them more courage, wisdom, ingenuity and fruitfulness in their ministry operations. Ask God for the rekindling of their zeal and passion and for provision of some basic ministry tools such as projectors, cars and a bus for mission exposure trips.

Sat. March 27: MSL Families and Friends — Appreciate God for the supportive roles of the MSL families and friends; ask the Lord to strengthen the cords of love, unity and harmony among MSL



families and friends. Also, ask for the Lord's blessing upon all the families and friends of the Ministry. Pray for better understanding and greater passion as they play their part in fulfilling the Great Commission.

Sun. March 28: The Unreached — Using Matthew 4:16, pray that the unreached peoples would discover the Light of Live and be liberated from all forms of traditional practices designed to perpetually keep them in bondage. Also, pray that those yearning for the Truth will not search or wait in vain; that the Christians or missionaries working among them would find ways to effectively minister the Gospel to the people.

Mon. March 29: Ministers' Children — Ministers' children are often the prime target of the enemy. Therefore, pray that they would have personal relationship with Christ early in life and that the Holy Spirit would circumcise their hearts, enabling them to win the battle against negative influences, the flesh and the world systems designed to lure people into sin.



Tues. March 30: Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) — Pray for comfort, healing and grace for the IDPs to forgive those responsible for their plight. Ask the Lord to raise people who would meet their spiritual and physical needs and for speedy restoration of peace and their resettlement. Pray for justice and fairness in the process of caring for and resettling those affected.

Wed. March 31: Christian Leaders — Pray that the Christian leaders would live exemplary lives; be selfless in service and faithful heralds of the Gospel who are versatile in the Scriptures and promote sound biblical precepts. Ask God to enable these leaders to have positive impact in their respective environments and to grant them wisdom to respond appropriately to the myriad of issues confronting the Church in our time.

APRIL

Thurs. April 01: Nigeria — Ask the Lord to stem the tide of corruption in Nigeria and bring about meaningful development of the critical infrastructures such as well-equipped hospitals, good roads, availability of portable water, steady power



supply, food security, uninterrupted academic programmes in all institutions of learning and the like.

Fri. April 02: Namibia — Pray that the nation's leaders would address the issues of poverty, land ownership and AIDS with wisdom and determination; for biblical faith to be restored in the churches and for unity and cooperation among the groups working to uplift Christ in the nation. Also, pray for reconciliation and healing from the legacy of apartheid and for fruitful outreaches to the less-evangelised peoples such as the San, Mbukushu, Wayeyi, Gckiruku and Few.

Sat. April 03: Sierra Leone— Pray for honesty from those in power and for the destruction of the influence of secret societies in the land. Pray that Christians will live lives of faith, depending on Jesus alone for provision, protection and victory. Also, pray for churches that balance the Word and the Spirit, for more trained pastors and fruitful outreaches to the Least Reached Peoples such as the Fula Jalon, Krio Fulani, Mandigo, Susu and a host of others.



Sun. April 04: Kenya — Nominalism is a major issue in this country, besides, the explosion of Independent churches also present dangers in financial and theological integrity as many of these churches adopt unbiblical beliefs and practices. Therefore, pray for revival and the integration of the Independent churches into biblical faith and church networks, for unity and increase in church leaders who are Spirit-filled and grounded in the Scriptures.

Mon. April 05: Uganda — Superficial Christianity characterised by materialism, polygamous practices and non-biblical worldviews as well as lack of unity are some of the major challenges of the Church in Uganda. Therefore, pray for a revival that would turn nominal Christians into disciples and for the Holy Spirit to lead Christians into all the truth and that all falsehood might be eradicated. Also, pray for unity and increase in church leaders who are guided by the Holy Spirit and Scriptures. Ask God to bless the labours of ministries focusing on children, youth and the hurting.



Tues. April 06: Djibouti — The few Somali and Afar believers are often isolated and suffer many pressures from relatives who may ostracize, beat or even kill them for deserting Islam. Therefore, pray that these believers would stand firm in their commitment to follow Jesus. Pray for endurance for the Christian workers in this harsh environment and for an unprecedented spiritual breakthrough that

would usher the indigenous peoples into faith in Jesus Christ.

Wed. April 07: Morocco — Morocco is 99.88% Muslim and only 0.09% Christian. Therefore, pray for more openness to the Gospel and for the community of believers to grow amidst persecution, for Spirit-filled leaders and that the believers would find jobs, admission into schools and born-again spouses. Also, pray that all schemes to hinder the spread of the Gospel in this nation would be broken by the power of the Holy Spirit and for fruitfulness in all the strategies being employed to evangelise this nation.

Thurs. April 08: Algeria — Legislation passed has made proselytism a criminal



offence and a law forbidding the “practice of non-Muslim worship” outside of preapproved buildings was cleverly followed by a spate of closing of churches. Thus, pray that the believers would respond to these pressures with faith and perseverance and that the Church in Algeria would continue to grow through bold witness and evangelism, be united and empowered financially.

Fri. April 09: Russia — Laws requiring educational licences to conduct instruction are being misused to stop Bible teaching on the academic and even informal level. Pray that those who seek to thwart God's work will instead see it grow and prosper and for

Church leaders to have the wisdom to guide Russia's Evangelicals in overcoming all forms of persecution. Also, ask God for effective partnering and viable strategies to plant churches among the unreached peoples in Russia.

Sat. April 10: Guyana — Pray for all believers to demonstrate the power of the Gospel in their unity, in their words and in holy living and for the true and uninterrupted Gospel to radically impact



unbelievers among them. Ask the Lord to envision and empower the Church to reach the many Hindu and Muslim communities with the Gospel. Also, pray for increased exploits in discipling the youths.

Sun. April 11: Australia — Issues of human origin, sexuality and the existence of God are hot topics for debate in Australia. Pray that the Evangelicals would communicate the truth in love, for a bold witness to the uniqueness of Jesus with humility and compassion. Also, pray for revival and reformation of the Church so that every sphere of society will be impacted positively. Finally, ask for God's blessing upon the labours of youth ministries and Christian media

Mon. April 12: Myanmar — Appreciate God for the continued growth of the Church amid great suffering and suppression; pray for her resilience, reconciliation, unity and that the Church will overcome both internal and external challenges. Also, pray for provision for those involved in ministry to children and for the indigenous Church to be well equipped with biblical truth and the right strategies to evangelise the nation.



Tues. April 13: Rajasthan — Appreciate God for the increasing number of converts and ask for greater harvest in the midst of harassment and persecution. Pray for the anti-conversion law to be reversed for the Gospel to spread rapidly. Pray for the believers to grow in faith, unity and perseverance and for them to boldly witness Christ to their kinsmen in love and wisdom.

Wed. April 14: Jordan — Pray that Christians would be salt and light in the Jordanian society and find ways to witness to nominal Christians as well as nonChristians and for more Jordanian believers to be called to full-time work. Pray for fruitful witness to Muslims, the protection of converts amid persecution and for the growing number of Muslim Background Believers (MBBs) to have the legal right to convert from Islam.

Thurs. April 15: Northern Cyprus (Turkish Cypriots) — About 99% of the population are Muslim and life for the few Christians among them is extremely difficult in all aspects. Therefore, ask God to strengthen the few believers, enabling them to respond to hatred and persecution with love, forgiveness and perseverance.



Also, pray for the revelation of Jesus Christ to the Muslim population as the Way, the Truth and the Life (John 14:6).

Fri. April 16: North Central Zone, Nigeria — This zone has been a point of spiritual contention over the years. Praise God for His hand that is mighty over this zone as He has helped the church to wax stronger despite series of attacks and crises. Ask the Lord to encounter the unbelievers in the region through dreams and visions and grant grace to those seeking the truth to find salvation in Jesus Christ.

Sat. April 17: The Barma of Borno — Ask God to deliver Barma people from all forms of oppressions. Pray that the light of Christ will penetrate the land and that the people be open and willing to receive the Gospel. Ask the Lord to send more labourers that will disciple the converts to maturity in Christ and that they will in turn make disciples of their kinsmen.

Sun. April 18: The Pere, Adamawa State — Thank God for the efforts and progress made towards making and sustaining converts among this people group. Ask God to give the missionaries the key to the hearts



of the people. Also, pray that the Lord would grant boldness to some of the people who have heard the Gospel to make decision for Christ and be steadfast.

Mon. April 19: The Kambari, Niger State

— Ask God to do a new thing in the land of Kambari and deliver the people from the bondage of the enemy such as wife snatching, polygamy, drunkenness and the like. Ask the Lord to empower Kambari believers to become witnesses of Jesus Christ unto their people.

Tues. April 20: The Warji, Bauchi State

— Ask the Lord to raise intercessory teams who would stand in the gap for the salvation of the Warji people. Pray for the salvation of the key leaders among them and declare that the Gospel would have free course among the people.

Wed. April 21: The Kontonkoro and Bangi, Niger State

— Praise God for brethren who relocated from their villages due to Fulani Herdsmen attacks to Kontonkoro and Bangi communities. These brethren have started meeting together to worship, pray and study the Bible. Ask the



Lord to cause them to wax stronger and grow the new fellowship centres in faith and supply all the resources needed to build churches and schools in Kontonkoro and Bangi communities. Pray that the insecurity situation will come to an end so the people can return to their villages to continue normal lives.

Thurs. April 22: The Urawa, Niger State — The people here are mostly animist and Muslims. Pray for the demonstration of Christ's power among them so that they might believe and follow Him. Ask God to deliver them from every power that has held them bound for years and to thrust labourers into the Urawa land.

Fri. April 23: Kotoko, Borno State — Pray that the light of Jesus Christ will penetrate the whole of Kotoko land despite all forms of opposition. Pray also that the people's hearts will be open to receive and understand the Gospel. Ask God to heal the broken-hearted and set the captives free that they may live in love with one another.

Sat. April 24: MSL Stakeholders — Ask God to endue MSL Stakeholders with the grace, wisdom, courage and strength



commensurate to His calling upon their lives and that they will always be led by the Holy Spirit in their ministry responsibilities. Pray for adequate provision of resources to meet up with both family and ministry responsibilities and for God's protection as they go about their duties within and outside the country.

Sun. April 25: MSL International Office

— God has been the Strong Anchor of the operations of the international work of Missions Supporters League. Thank Him for the successful operations of this office despite the lack of workers. Pray for more fruits and open doors for the International operations of MSL and for renewed grace, wisdom and guidance for the leadership and staff.

Mon. April 26: MSL East Africa

— The International Office is making in-roads into some countries in East Africa. Pray for safety, resources and open doors in churches as the MSL Regional Director travels to raise partners and volunteers for the work in the region. Pray for endurance, patience and perseverance for chapter members and volunteers that they will remain committed to finishing the task of



the Great Commission from this region to the ends of the earth.

Tues. April 27: MSL Staff

Members/Missionaries — Pray that MSL staff and missionaries will put their trust more in the Lord. Pray that they will be more prayerful and joyful in His service and also faithful to their calling. Pray for grace and courage for them to overcome challenges in ministry. Ask God to meet their needs according to His riches in Christ Jesus and to also protect them from the devices of the enemy.

Wed. April 28: Missionaries/Christian

Workers — Being a Missionary/Christian worker in this end time is becoming more challenging as persecution of Christians is on the increase globally. Ask the Lord to send help to all persecuted workers and pray for peace and comfort amidst their challenges. Pray that God will continually watch over Missionaries/Christian workers wherever they are labouring and turn their ashes to beauty as He grants fruitfulness to their efforts toward salvation of souls.

Thurs. April 29: The Physically Challenged/Destitute — Thank God for



life and sustainability He has granted to these group of people. Pray that the Lord will continually renew their sense of purpose, manifest their gifts and talents and make them agents of community development and nation building. Ask God to grant them wisdom to relate freely with their neighbours in love, boldness to participate actively in decision-making positions in the nation and adequate provision to be relevant in their families and communities.

Fri. April 30: The Body of Christ in Africa — “The mark of a great church is not its seating capacity but its sending capacity” – Mike Stachura. Ask the Lord to equip the body of Christ in Africa with the vision for the unreached. Pray against every spirit of denominationalism and materialism that is distracting the church today and ask that the various churches will be united as one body and learn from the early church in sending and supporting mission work and missionaries.

MAY

Sat. May 01: Nigeria — Ask the Lord to grant Nigerian leaders and the citizens



wisdom in dealing with the myriad of issues that impede progress and meaningful development in the nation such as terrorism, regional agitations, poor economy, poor industrial development, unemployment, abandoned projects by successive governments and placing of personal, tribal and regional interests above national interest.

Sun. May 02: Swaziland — Pray that the African Independent churches in Swaziland would be guided by Scripture and directed by the Holy Spirit and that the Church community would demonstrate purity and fidelity in marriage. Also, pray for revival in the Church and for church leaders to imbibe holistic ministry so the love of Jesus Christ might be seen in practical ways in alleviating the pains of multitudes suffering from HIV/AIDS.

Mon. May 03: Egypt — Appreciate God for the positive response of Muslims to the Gospel through the use of electronic media and ask for increased receptiveness to the Gospel. Pray that the citizens disillusioned with conflict would discover the Light of the World and the Prince of Peace. Also, pray for more supply of trained church



leaders and for Christians to stand firm in their faith, living exemplary lives in the face of persecution.

Tues. May 04: Angola — Sadly, Angola experienced forty years of almost constant war (1962-2002). Therefore, pray for genuine reconciliation and healing of the invisible wounds and for the Church to play significant role in overcoming the longstanding tribal loyalties and partisan politics. Ask God to raise more Spirit filled and godly leaders and that churches will be more envisioned and deliberate in evangelizing and discipling children and young people.

Wed. May 05: South Africa — Pray for those in leadership to uphold righteousness and justice, for reconciliation among all races and for the Church to be united and have prophetic voice in a society that no longer holds to moral absolutes. Also, pray for wisdom and more provision for ministries reaching young people and children and for the emergence of viable churches among Muslim peoples.

Thurs. May 06: Guinea — The Christian population is still a small minority, the



Church suffered serious numerical setbacks in the late 1990s and early 2000s due to nominal Christians falling away. Therefore, pray for perseverance for believers, and pray against the enemy who seeks to destroy these young or weak Christians before they can grow. Also, ask God to raise more godly leaders and for many youths to be drawn to Christ through the efforts of the various youth ministries.

Fri. May 07: Tunisia — The government prohibits indigenous churches from owning their own property and having bank accounts. Pray for the return of all the buildings and land that were previously taken over by the State. Also, pray for the disillusioned youths to find Life and Hope in Christ and for the Christians, foreign and nationals to maximise the open doors and opportunities to reach the people with the Gospel.

Sat. May 08: El Salvador — This nation suffered oppression and 12 years of civil war, therefore, pray for repentance, reconciliation, recovery from the social and psychological wounds and a fair society based on respect for human rights. Also, pray for effective ministry among the



Amerindians and for the Church to find ingenious ways of reaching the youths to salvage the future of the Church in El Salvador.

Sun. May 09: Nicaragua — Deep-seated poverty occasioned by civil war and natural disasters, distorted political ideologies and division among and even within churches on liberation theology, the work of the Holy Spirit and interpersonal conflicts are major challenges affecting the Church in Nicaragua. Please, pray for the Church to surmount these obstacles and that the believers might have the wisdom and determination to be righteous influences on the nation in all spheres.

Mon. May 10: Antigua & Barbuda — Antiguanans are almost all Christians by background but sadly, complacency and strongholds of sin remain entrenched – drug dealing, violence, gambling and others. Therefore, pray that righteous authorities and the prayers of the saints would breakdown the structures of sin. Also, pray for unity in the Church and that the Abundant Life Radio and Caribbean Radio Lighthouse would have great influences for the Kingdom of God.



Tues. May 11: Paraguay — The Roman Catholic Church dominates the spiritual and political life of Paraguay, admirably opposing corruption and immorality but also promoting superstitious traditionalism and occult practices of pre-Christian deities and customs, holding millions in bondage. Therefore, pray to break this bondage, for spiritual awakening, a balanced faith that submits to both the Word and the Holy Spirit and unity among the churches.

Wed. May 12: Malaysia — There are over 100 radical Islamist groups with unending agitation for sharia and the subjugation of all Malaysia to a much stricter version of Islam. Pray against the imposition of a harsh, aggressive Islam which would negatively impact moderates, minorities and any Christian ministry. Also, pray for Malays to encounter Jesus, for unity, perseverance, fearlessness and wisdom for Christians seeking to share the Good News with Muslims.

Thurs. May 13: Argentina — Pray for the release of multitudes held in spiritual bondage by the forces of false religions such as occultism, Mormonism,



postmodern agnosticism, Islam, spiritism and the like. Also, pray for more Spiritfilled and godly leaders to be trained and released for ministry and for wisdom to reach the Quechua and Aymara, the youths and the sophisticated upper class with the Gospel.

Fri. May 14: Palau — About 95.90% of the people claim Christianity but nominalism is widespread; mixture of Christianity with magic, materialism, alcoholism and pluralism are great threats to Christianity in the Island and the younger generation. Therefore, ask God for revival especially in the Koror Evangelical Church, for the removal of the hindrances to the Gospel in this Island and for ingenious ways of reaching the smaller unevangelized communities with the Gospel.

Sat. May 15: Nauru — The economy of Nauru is in shambles; almost half of the indigenous population have diabetes, 90% are overweight and unemployed. Pray for healing for the people and sustainable economic solutions that would provide livelihoods for those making the Island their home. Pray for greater spiritual



awakening and increase in the number of Evangelical Christians.

Sun. May 16: Nigeria Evangelical Missionary Institute (NEMI) — Thank God for using this Institution to transform lives and equip God's people for more effective Kingdom service. Pray for more grace, wisdom and favour for the Principal and his team as they provide leadership and mobilise resources to execute various projects in the School. Also, ask God to bless all the partners and raise more strategic partnerships to improve the quality of life and services in the Institute.

Mon. May 17: Calvary International Africa — Appreciate God for the leadership and staff of this Ministry for their efforts in advancing God's Kingdom in the nations. Pray for greater and abiding fruits in all the mission fields and other aspects of their ministry operations. Ask God for more labourers and for renewed strength, grace and provisions for all the missionaries.

Tues. May 18: Pleroma Missions — Thank God for the lives of those serving under this platform and ask for greater



grace, renewed strength, courage and provisions for their work. Pray especially for their fields in Kogi State, break down the strongholds of idolatry and false religions that are holding many people groups in the State captive. Ask the Holy Spirit to brood over Kogi State, dispelling darkness and ushering in Light and freedom for the captives.

Wed. May 19: Mission Alliance For Africa (MAFA) — Give thanks to God for the efforts of MAFA in accomplishing God's mandate in several mission fields. Please pray that God's hand will continually rest on the leaders and the staff to do the will of God. Ask the Lord to reward their efforts with abiding fruits and to grant them grace and wisdom to continue bringing in the harvest.

Thurs. May 20: Christian Missionary Foundation (CMF) — Appreciate God for the leadership and staff of this Ministry and pray for more labourers, increased grace and provisions for their work. Pray for renewed vision, encouragement and safety for all the missionaries. Ask God for favour in acquiring and developing a property in Ibadan for the Ministry Headquarters.



Fri. May 21: Calvary Ministries (CAPRO) — Thank God for the labours of this agency in reaching the nations with the message of salvation across the globe. Sat. May 29: Christian Homes — Praise God for the gift of beautiful families and homes; ask Him to restore Christian values



in families that are having challenges and heal broken homes. Pray for grace, steadfastness and safety for Christian homes, especially those in hostile environments.

Sun. May 30: 10/40 Window — Of the 55 least evangelized countries, 97% of their population live within the 10/40 Window. 90% of the people living in the 10/40 window are unevangelized. Pray for revival and massive salvation of souls across this window and pull down every stronghold of the host of darkness operating here thereby preventing the Gospel from prospering in this window. Ask God for grace, divine provision and strength for every missionary and mission agency labouring in the 10/40 window.

Mon. May 31: The Body of Christ in Nigeria — Thank God for His mercy and grace upon His Church in Nigeria. Pray for love and unity amongst Christians and for collaborated efforts geared towards finishing the Great Commission. Ask the Lord to grant boldness to His children in positions of authority so as to positively influence every sphere of the nation with God's Kingdom agenda. Pray that the Lord



will use the Church to bring forth and sustain the New Nigeria in righteousness where love, justice and peace reigns.

JUNE

Tues. June 01: Nigeria — Ask God to work through the Nigerian judicial system and use her as a tool in promoting the rule of law and justice in the land. Also, pray that the Lord would raise God-fearing people through whom there will be a cleansing and purging of the judiciary; ask God to put godly people in the National Judicial Council and bless all the righteous lawyers, judges and magistrates.

Wed. June 02: Liberia — Pray for economic recovery, genuine reconciliation and harmonious co-existence among the various ethnic groups and healing for the traumatised. Pray for provision of funds for the Christian radio ministries and the production of excellent content that will reach and bless the entire nation. Finally, pray against the spread of false religions; pray for the emergence of viable indigenous churches among the Vai, Gola and Maninka people groups.



Thurs. June 03: Comoros — Christians face severe persecution in this nation, evangelism is forbidden and Christian converts could face stiff reprisals from the community and their own family. Therefore, pray for perseverance for Christians and for the steady growth of the Church in the midst of painful trials. Ask God for abundant fruit from the services of Christian medical and veterinary workers.



Mon. June 07: Somalia — Somalia is predominantly Muslim with only 0.33% as Christian. An infant Somali Church is emerging amid great tribulation. Pray for perseverance for Christians and that all forms of religious tyranny and injustice against women and children be thwarted. Also, pray that the leaders in this nation would respect human rights and work for the emergence and sustenance of true religious freedom.

Tues. June 08: Hungary — Sadly, Hungarians have lost touch with the Gospel with many seeking answers to life issues in materialism, hedonism, alcohol and false religions. Pray for all falsehoods and empty philosophies to be exposed and for Christ to be exalted as the people again see the truth of the Gospel and the freedom it brings. Pray for the Holy Spirit to bring about revival in the land.

Wed. June 09: Switzerland — Pray that God would sustain and increase the unity among churches of different backgrounds for the purpose of proclaiming Christ. Also, pray for more wisdom and fruitfulness for churches and organisations involved in outreach to children and youths such as the International Christian Fellowship, SU, CEF, IFES and the like; ask God to bless

the initiatives to propagate the Gospel through the media.

Fri. June 04: North Sudan — The recent legislation making North Sudan a secular State is a positive development. Let us appreciate God for this and ask that there would be fairness and that freedom of religion would be respected. Also, pray for wisdom for the church to maximize this open door to evangelise the nation. Pray for peace to reign and for the few believers to remain resilient and united.

Sat. June 05: Benin Republic — Pray and demolish all structures of unrighteousness and corruption in the nation's economy; pray for Nigeria's influence to become a more positive and godly one. Ask God for revival in the churches, to raise more Godfearing Church leaders and for the entrenchment of biblical Christianity in the land. Pray that multitudes who are involved in the occult would turn to Christ and become His faithful witnesses.

Sun. June 06: Burundi — Pray that God would continue to use the Church in Burundi to promote peace and genuine reconciliation among the various ethnic groups. Pray for more supply of workers and other resources for ministries that focus



on caring for children and youth especially in the rural areas and for effective ways of outreach to the Muslim peoples in the land.

Thurs. June 10: Andorra — Materialism holds Andorra in a tight grip with low level of spirituality and the Church is on the defensive. Many consult mediums, seers and astrologers for guidance and advice. Therefore, pray for revival in the churches and for the Holy Spirit to expose and disarm the powers of the occult. Also, pray that all faithful disciples of Christ might have the passion to share their faith.

Fri. June 11: United Kingdom — Pray for national repentance and restoration to spiritual vigour that once made the Church in Britain a blessing to the whole world. Pray that the British would regain confidence in the Gospel and that the Church in Britain would maximise the opportunities presented by immigration to see new churches planted, new peoples reached and Christ glorified.

Sat. June 12: Brazil — It is speculated that Brazil is probably more Spiritist than Catholic in underlying worldview.

Therefore, pray for all spiritual falsehoods to be exposed and for Christ alone to be exalted as Lord in Brazil; pray for those in spiritual bondage to be delivered through Jesus' name. Also, pray for unity in the churches and that the Bible and its truth would mould the lives of Catholics.

Sun. June 13: Colombia — Pray that Satan's hold on Colombia be broken and for



Christ's Lordship to vanquish the spirits of violence, revenge, lawlessness, occult practices and all manner of corruption and hindrances to the Gospel. Pray for the unity of the Church and for more creativity and fruitfulness for ministries targeting students and youths.

Mon. June 14: New Caledonia — Pray for wisdom for the political leaders to adequately address the challenge of inequality in the society and for ministries that will help rescue those hooked on substance abuse into full and vibrant life in Christ. Also, pray for the emergence of a truly biblical and truly Kanak Church that demonstrates the power of Jesus over the evil one.

Tues. June 15: Guam — Pray for biblical righteousness to shape Guam's society and public life, for unity in the churches and the emergence of a true Chamorro Christian witness and culture. Appreciate God for the gains being made through prison ministry and pray for resources to teach and train converts who are still in prison. Pray for more workers and greater impact of the Christian radio with broadcasts reaching China, Cambodia and several other nations.



Wed. June 16: Ura Field, Niger State — This field has experienced devastation due to the insecurity in the region. Ask God to stir up the few Christians in this community

to pray and reach out to the Ura people with the gospel of Jesus Christ and that God would bring lasting peace to the community. Pray against the spread of false religions, ask God to open the eyes of the people to the deceit of these religions and that the Christian converts will be rooted in Christ.

Thurs. June 17: Kakanda, Kogi State — Ask God to raise prayer teams to soften and open up the spiritual landscape through worship and intercession. Pray that Jesus Christ will reveal Himself to the people and that God will manifest Himself in many ways that will bring forth a viable and vibrant Church in Kakanda land.

Fri. June 18: Kaivi (Kalbi), Kaduna State — Pray that the Gospel of Jesus Christ will prevail among this group of people and that the light of the Gospel will liberate them from false religions prevalent in the land.



Ask the Lord to raise labourers that will reach out to the people.

Sat. June 19: Gerewa, Bauchi State — Pray against the hostility of the people towards Christianity and for salvation of their prominent leaders as this would facilitate the spreading of the Gospel in the land. Pray also against the fear of persecution and that the people will be bold enough to accept Jesus Christ as Lord.

Sun. June 20: Bangawa/Wurawa, Kebbi State — Stand against satanic forces in this land and loosen their grip over the lives of the people. Ask God to raise and equip passionate and anointed missionaries to reach the people as they wait to hear the gospel of Jesus Christ. Pray God to encounter those that desire to be Christians among them, answer the numerous questions on their hearts and dispel all their fears.

Mon. June 21: Angbaku Field, Nasarawa State — Pray for the children of The Samuel's Academy in Nursery, Primary and Secondary classes, that Christ will be formed in them and that their lives will



daily glorify God as Gospel Ambassadors. Pray for divine provision to build lasting physical school structures that will enhance more intakes of Fulani children. Ask the Lord to do a spiritual work in the land to soften the hearts of the people so that the Gospel will blossom therein.

Tues. June 22: Fali, Adamawa State — Pray against the quiet and subtle advance of Islam upon this land and for more agencies and churches to target the people for the Gospel. Animist on the mountains can be very aggressive; pray for grace, courage and wisdom for the few Christians among them to reach out to their own people. Pray for dedicated missionaries who will be willing to live with them on the mountains.

Wed. June 23: Isawa, Bauchi State — Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal the whole truth about Jesus Christ to this people as they seek Him through other religions and to convict them to worship the only true God. Ask God to send forth more labourers to serve among the Isawa people.

Thurs. June 24: MSL United States of America (USA) — Thank God for



sustaining the work in MSL USA and ask Him to grant fruitfulness to every effort made towards establishing new MSL Chapters in USA and its neighbouring countries. Pray that God will raise more committed members to increase the membership and efforts of the current Chapter in the USA and ask Him to bless the members abundantly so they can support more projects amongst Djimini People in Cote d'Ivoire.
