

The Mission


To raise prayer, material, financial and other aspects of support for missions through the mobilization of the Church for the salvation of nations.

JANUARY

Sun. Jan. 01: New Year — Happy Prosperous New Year! Thank God for all He did in your life, family, community and country in 2022. Praise God for the opportunity and privilege you have to see 2023 in good health and sound mind. Ask God to help you and believers everywhere become instruments through which His love will spread to all peoples (tribes) and people. Pray for God's direction and guidance over your life and that of your loved ones in this New Year and that every hope, desire and aspiration be fulfilled according to His purpose.

Mon. Jan. 02: Nigeria — Nigeria celebrated her 62nd Independence anniversary in October 2022, with little to show for it despite the human capacity and natural resources available in the country. Public fund embezzlement, social injustice, bribery, internet fraud, petty scam, drug and human trafficking, armed robbery, kidnapping and terrorism have torn apart the value system. As the 2023 general election comes next month, pray that the electorates will vote wisely to elect good and empathic leaders based on competence and not sentiment. Pray against the plans of the devil over Nigeria and the Church of Christ and ask that the glory of the Nation be restored.

Tues. Jan. 03: Botswana — Praise God for the political stability, economic growth and lower corruption level in Botswana. The roughly 2.4 million people, 65.5% are Christian adherent and the country has no Unreached People Group. Thank God for the growth and pray that it will increase and be sustained. AIDS has devastated the country as it has the world's second-highest prevalence of AIDS after Eswatini, which has

stolen 28 years from the nation's life expectancy. Pray for the success of the government's programme to make anti-retroviral drugs available through the public sector and that the people will make judicious use of this programme.

Wed. Jan. 04: Namibia — Stability and economic progress followed independence in the 1990s and Christians united in prayer at that time. However, the country could fall into ethnic conflict and economic collapse if good government and community harmony do not prevail. Pray that the nation's leaders would address with wisdom and determination the gap between the rich and poor; land ownership issues and HIV/AIDS. Liberal theology and syncretistic Afro-Spiritism eroded its spiritual heritage; pray for a biblical faith to be restored throughout Namibia's many churches.

Thurs. Jan. 05: Seychelles — The vast majority of Seychellois claim to be Christian, but evidence of true spiritual transformation seems outweighed by superstition and nominalism. Pray that the Holy Spirit may bring new life evidenced by repentance and sustained fruit. Ask God to raise and equip locals who will take the Gospel to their neighbours and to adjoining countries in Europe.

Fri. Jan. 06: Togo — The political and economic situation remains unstable. The military coup and unfair elections created resentment between the Southern (Guinean) and Central-northern (Gur) peoples who dominate politics. Pray that God breaks down the bitterness between them. False shepherds and unbalanced prosperity

people. Ask the Almighty God to protect and preserve the missionaries and their families as they tenaciously labour for the salvation of nations.

Tues. June 27: Nigerian Youths — Pray that God will prepare the hearts of Nigerian youths and cause a massive revival among students generally to totally surrender their lives to Jesus Christ and respond to missions accordingly. Pray also that the body of Christ universally would seize the opportunities the envisaged revival present to properly disciple the new converts.

Wed. June 28: Bible Translators — Thank God for the efforts of the Bible Translators globally. Pray that God will continue to protect, sustain and equip them to make the Scripture accessible, handy and available in various Unreached People Groups' languages. Pray that the Bible will continue to get to those who earnestly and diligently seek it despite oppositions.

Thurs. June 29: The Universal Church — Thank God for the coming global revival and pray that God would raise end-time prophets/mobilizers to blow the trumpet in Zion and awaken all sleeping giants in the global Church for missions. Using Matthew 16:18-19, ask that the keys of the kingdom of heaven given to the Church will be used to open every process, system and nation to the Gospel and declare the victorious promise of Christ against the gates of Hades wrestling with the Universal Church.

Fri. June 30: Pray for Yourself — Thank God for grace to intercede for nations in this first half of the year. Using 3John v.2, ask the Lord to prosper you spiritually, mentally, bodily,

Fri. June 23: MSL Prayer and Mobilization Centre — Using Philippians 4:6, thank God for the vision of this Centre and for the miraculous way He is going to materialize it. Pray for the needed people and connections that will facilitate the project. Ask the Lord to give increase to every effort put into actualizing this project and that the processing of documents and construction work will go on smoothly without any hitch once started.

Sat. June 24: MSL Mobilization Thrust — The vision of MSL is driven through the mobilization of the Church for global mission; pray that MSL will begin to enjoy greater access to churches and Church leaders for mission awareness and mobilization. Also ask the Lord to prosper the mobilization efforts of the ministry across nations and give increase to the workforce for the work of the ministry.

Sun. June 25: MSL Gwagwalada Chapter — This Chapter is partnering with the Gospel Balm Missions to reach the Taba people of the FCT with the Good news. Pray that the Lord will prosper the efforts of this Chapter under the current leadership. Ask God to bless all members as they labour to establish and advance God's kingdom among the Taba people and environs cut off from civilization by the Gurara River. Pray that the fruits of this labour shall abide till eternity.

Mon. June 26: MSL Nigeria — MSL Nigeria is currently partnering with over 90 Missionaries labouring among the Unreached People Groups across Nigeria and beyond. The national insecurity is affecting most of the adopted mission fields; using 1Chronicles 16:21-22, pray that God will rebuke the oppressors of His

teachings are also increasing as the true Church grows. Pray that strong, indigenous congregations and denominations with solid teachings, biblical worldviews and visionary leadership be established.

Sat. Jan. 07: Mozambique — Mozambique is one of the poorest and most underdeveloped countries in the world, though with one of the highest GDP growths. Of the Mozambique's 31.9 million people, 52.4% are Christians and about 11 Unreached People Groups (18.0%) exist but in recent years the country has experienced a rise in Islamic insurgency. Pray for sustenance of the economy and growth in the agriculture sector. Ask God to put an end to the insurgency by Islamist groups. Pray against inequality between the northern and southern regions and pray against corruption.

Sun. Jan. 08: Sao Tome & Principe — The majority of the population are Roman Catholics, but practice is usually mixed with deep-seated African spiritist beliefs. Appeasing spirits and ancestors is often of greater importance than honouring God. Pray that the Holy Spirit will move through the Catholic Church, bringing renewal. Pray for the sovereignty of Jesus Christ to be clearly demonstrated amid syncretized Catholicism, the growth of Islam and marginal sects.

Mon. Jan. 09: Iraq — The humanitarian crisis in Iraq remains one of the largest and the most volatile in the world. Conflict has destroyed livelihoods and infrastructure, and many have been threatened, displaced and injured. Islam is the largest religion with 95.8%, with 25 of 35 people groups yet unreached. Pray for peace to

return to Iraq, and ask God for comfort and relief to the numerous families and communities that have been affected. Ask God to bring to an end terrorism and extremism that have ravaged the country for over decades now, and that the Sunni and Shi'a sects of Islam will see the need for reconciliation and understanding.

Tues. Jan. 10: Malaysia — Malaysian society faces an uncertain future. The Malay- and Islam-centric UMNO party dominated Malaysia's political scene from independence, which enriched a small portion of them at the expense of everyone else, but was defeated in the 2018 elections. Pray for leaders who must hold the country together in ways that satisfy both moderate and conservative Muslims, as well as the sizeable and diverse minorities. Pray for Christian publishers and ministries to be strong and shrewd in defending their legal rights in the face of government restrictions and ban on the use of Malay language Bible and other Christian materials.

Wed. Jan. 11: Israel — There have been constant hostilities between Israel and her Arab neighbours for decades over land, which the Israelis now occupy. The recent is the takeover of Palestinian land in the West Bank by Israel, which has left many casualties, with more on the Palestinian side. Ask the Lord to make leaders on both sides come up with policies and to take the right decisions towards making an agreement that will bring lasting peace to the region. Ask the Lord to strengthen and embolden the Christian community, and that through the Church many Jewish people will come to Christ.

Tues. June 20: Chamba Dirim, Adamawa State — Some of the Dirim, also known as the Dakka, have converted to Islam due to Muslim Fulani influence, yet majority still practice their traditional ethnic religion. Ask the Holy Spirit to show missions agencies working among the Dirim culturally relevant ways to reach them and to send additional missionaries to join the few working among them. Pray that God will use the Dirim believers (0.40% of 19,000 people) to share the love of Christ with their own people.

Wed. June 21: Eloyi Afo, Benue State — The Eloyi are scattered among Benue and Plateau provinces. The Eloyi believe in the impersonal god, Owo and also in witchcraft, magic and divination with strings. Thank God for the few Christian resources available to them and pray that God will give the Eloyi believers boldness to share Christ with their own people. Ask the Lord of the harvest to send forth labourers into central Nigeria to work among the Eloyi and bring forth a growing Eloyi church for the glory of His name.

Thurs. June 22: MSL Publications, Programmes and Projects — MSL is in need of Staff and Expertise in the areas of ICT, Media, Administration, Project Management, Account and Publication. Pray that God will send to MSL diligent and faithful workers who are skilled in the above areas. Ask the Lord to raise supporters to adopt MSL Publications for sponsorship and that the publications will reach nations to spur the hearts of the readers to live a life on mission with God. Ask for divine provisions for Staff Welfare Intervention Fund (SWIF), Simon of Cyrene Project (SCyP), Welfare of Missionary Retirees

otherwise called Ahan and no Christian resources currently available in Ahan. Ask God to send labourers; pray that the Holy Spirit will give the people teachable and understanding hearts and bring them into a rich experience of God's blessing. Pray for the Ahan culture to be shaped into a God-centered and God-honoring mold.

Sat. June 17: — Bassa Bajingala, Abuja — They are made up of Paiko-Bassa (about 600) and Tugbudu (2,000) peoples, practicing Traditional Religion and Islam. Pray for the deliverance of the people from idol worship and that the veil in their eyes be removed to see Jesus Christ, the Lord and Saviour. Pray that the Christian Missionary Foundation's (CMF) discipleship efforts will yield good fruits and ask for provision and protection for the missionaries labouring among the peoples.

Sun. June 18: Dogongada Field, Kebbi State — Pray that the Lord would thwart the schemes of the devil and his agents over the land. Ask for financial provision to complete the church building project in the field and also for land purchase to build a church in Fadaman Dudu field. Pray for peace and protection of missionaries and their families labouring in these fields.

Mon. June 19: Buduma (Yedina), Borno State

— The Buduma are one of the proud descendants of the Kanem-Bornu Empire. They are feared for their offensive raids and aggressive reputations and usually left alone finding comfort in their aquatic environ. Pray that Christ will be revealed to them as the way, the truth and the life. Pray that the abundance of natural resources in their land will point them to the one and true God and for peace in Buduma land.

Thurs. Jan. 12: Armenia — Pray for good relationships with nearby countries. Centuries of bitter conflict, oppression and massacres left Armenians with hatred and mistrust of nations such as Turkey and Azerbaijan. Diplomatic solutions have failed; therefore pray for an answer to this situation. Pray that Armenians would forgive. Pray for God to establish trust, cooperation and trade among Armenia, Turkey and Azerbaijan.

Fri. Jan. 13: Papua New Guinea (PNG) — Papua New Guinea continues to face a wide range of crises such as vast ethnic diversity, tribal fighting, revenge killings and HIV infections etc. to the point where some observers question whether the nation can continue to function as such. Widespread corruption limits progress and foreign aid meant to help local workers rarely reaches them. Pray for peace beyond non-violence to bring true unity and for national identity that rises above ethnic ties. Pray for revival throughout the PNG Church and for leaders to develop vision and initiatives reflective of Christ's mission.

Sat. Jan. 14: Samoa — Samoa is a country of about 200,144 people. Samoans have been Christian (96.6%) for over a century and every village has at least one church. Mormonism is a point of contention with fast growing rate, also sending and receiving more missionaries to and fro Samoa than any other religion. Pray for all seeking to win Mormons to Jesus Christ and to enlighten Samoan Christians of Mormonism's errors. Pray for revival within churches to war against further spread of Mormonism.

Sun. Jan. 15: Vanuatu — Vanuatu's motto is "In God We Stand". Pray that leaders of this complex small country will be examples in doing so. Revival has occurred on some islands and in several denominations; however some islands are still spiritually stagnant. Pray for the training of Christian leaders in the seven Bible colleges/schools. Pray that both pastors and group leaders would lead with guidance from the Word and the Holy Spirit.

Mon. Jan. 16: Tonga — Tonga is a strongly Christian nation that sends significant numbers of missionaries from both Catholic and Protestant traditions, despite relative poverty and isolation. Much can be done; pray for the ministries of YWAM and other evangelical groups working toward this. The proliferation of denominations generates competition among churches, as newer groups entice believers away. Isolation and the difficult economic situation complicate issues further. Pray that Tongan Christians would seek ways to contribute to the Kingdom of God rather than seeking the church that benefits them the most.

Tues. Jan. 17: NEMA — Nigeria Evangelical Missions Association (NEMA) celebrated 40 years Anniversary in July 2022 with positive records of increase in number of indigenous missionaries from 600 over 15,000 serving in several countries, having now over 130 registered member churches and agencies with reduced the number of Unreached, Unengaged and least evangelised people groups from over 70 in 2017 to about 43 by 2021. Praise God for His faithfulness in NEMA and pray for greater

take decisive stance against violent crimes, drug cartels and corruption. Pray for spiritual and physical protection for believers and residents of Colombia facing the threats of violence for their commitment to Christ. Pray for equal treatment for all citizens of the country.

Wed. June 14: New Caledonia — The indigenous New Caledonians profess Christianity but the Gospel is often confused with Western culture. Animist practices usually undermine Christian essence. Pray for the church leadership and Gospel preachers to discern between tradition and the true Gospel. Pray for the Kanaks (indigenous people) growing faith to demonstrate the power of the Holy Ghost over the evil one. Most Caledoche are culturally Roman Catholic but lack genuine faith; pray that revival fire be ignited in the New Caledonian Church to cover the nation.

Thurs. June 15: Guam — Guam is a U.S. Island territory with a military base, but nearly one-third of the people are Asians with three-fourth of them being Roman Catholics. This tourist hub of roughly 170,180 people has more than a million people visit it per year. Pray for unity and harmonious living among the diverse cultures and churches in the Island. Pray that as visiting tourists coming to the country, they will encounter and experience the love of Christ. Ask the Lord to bring a revival to the majority Catholic Church and rid the Church of nominalism and animistic practices.

Fri. June 16: Ahan, Ekiti State — The Ahan are a small sub-tribe of the Yoruba found mostly in Omuo Ekiti. They are about 600 people with majority practicing Ethnic religion and only

spirituality is thin and the Church is on defensive. Pray that the empty materialism would be seen as the ultimately unfulfilling falsehood that it is and ask God to reinvigorate the Christian spiritual life of Andorra by the Holy Spirit. Ask God to expose and disarm the power of occult many seek for guidance.

Sun. June 11: United Kingdom (UK) — Appreciate God for the enduring history and heritage of Christianity the UK is known for and for her contribution to the growth of Christianity globally. Pray that UK's influence in the world will be used for what is just and right. Ask for God's wisdom and blessing for both the King and the Prime Minister leading the UK as they positively impact the commonwealth nations. Pray that Christians be burdened to pray for revival and to be freed from deadening negativism and materialism that pervade the churches.

Mon. June 12: Brazil — Brazil hosts one of the largest Evangelical populations in the world and she's very strong in prayer meetings and movements. Praise God for Brazilian prayer warriors! Ask God to rid the majority Roman Catholic of the spirit of nominalism and spiritism. Pray for spiritual maturity and impact throughout the rapidly growing Evangelical Church. Pray for a more humane political leadership and harmony within the democratic structures in the country.

Tues. June 13: Colombia — Colombia is known for its serenity, beautiful natural features and diversity. Unfortunately, the country is now associated with violence, drug cartels, high homicide and other criminalities. Pray for a wise, visionary and God-fearing government that will

grace for the leaders and members to accomplish the mandate of the association.

Wed. Jan. 18: Kariya, Bauchi State — The Kariya people are located in Ganjuwa LGA, having population of about 4,700 and Islam as the dominant religion. Though they are outwardly Muslims, yet depend on the spirit world for their daily needs. They live in fear of evil spirits and just a few (5%) have known the Way. Pull down every stronghold that has kept the people blinded to the message of the Gospel. Pray for divine encounters for the leaders of the Kariya and ask that they be used of the Lord to bring salvation to their own people. Pray for wisdom, grace and strength for the few Kariya believers to live a worshipping lifestyle among the people.

Thurs. Jan. 19: Baggara (Shuwa Arab), Borno State — The Baggara tribes are of Arab descent and mainly speak the Shuwa dialect known as Chadian Arabic. They are about 258,000 in population and have been Muslims since the 13th Century. Pray that God will raise prayer teams and long-term workers to break up the land through intercession and labour. Ask that the Baggara people will be accessible and receptive towards the Gospel. Thank God for the 0.20% Baggara Christians and pray that the Holy Spirit will complete the work He begun in their hearts through adequate discipleship.

Fri. Jan. 20: Kitimi, Kaduna State — The majority of Kitimi claim to be Sunni Muslims while another significant portion practice animism. They are approximately 5,200 people and their primary occupation is farming. Pray for

adequate rain for their crops and their livestock to live free of want and poverty. Pray for the 4% believers among this people group to disciple others and that networks of believing families and fellowships will open doors for others to follow Jesus Christ.

Sat. Jan. 21: Duwai, Yobe State — They have been Muslims since the 11th century, though mix it with African traditional religions. They have rejected Nigerian missionary efforts and anyone who accepts Christian literature could be persecuted. No Christian resources in Duwai language, therefore, pray for effective production and distribution of Scripture and other Christian materials in the Duwai language. Pray for God's mighty visitation among them and that the ongoing effort to reach them with the Gospel would yield abundant fruits.

Sun. Jan. 22: Shanga, Sokoto State — The Shanga is an offshoot of the Kengawa people comprising a part of the Songhai Empire from the 13th to 16th centuries. They are about 27,000 people, having Islam (92%) as the largest religion with no known Christian. Pray the Lord of the harvest to send forth labourers to the Shanga people. Ask God to raise prayer teams that will break up the soil through worship and intercession. Ask God to water the seeds of the Gospel sown and to establish a viable church among the Shanga.

Mon. Jan. 23: Guruntum, Bauchi State — The majority of the Guruntum are ethnic religionists, following their traditional beliefs. However, Islam is beginning to gain a foothold in their

God to neutralize all acts of terror by the Islamists militants and restore peace to Somalia. Pray for courage, boldness and safety of those who are sharing the Gospel in this hostile environment. Ask the Lord to uphold and grant grace to the believing minority suffering great persecution and martyrdom.

Thurs. June 08: Hungary — Thank God that Hungary has recovered economically from its years under the communist rule. Although it possesses natural resources, fertile land, with growth in industrial base, yet disillusion, dissatisfaction and upheaval against the government often characterize the life in Hungary. Pray that all elected officials would look past their political agencies, root out the widespread corruption and labour toward improving life for the whole nation. Pray for recommitment to evangelism, holiness and spiritual maturity within Hungarian churches.

Fri. June 09: Switzerland — One of the world's oldest existing republics. Its centuries old neutrality has allowed the nation to become one of the wealthiest in the world. However, Switzerland's rich Christian heritage is fast eroding. Pray for the barriers of apathy, wealth and vague religiosity to be overcome by a deep hunger for God. Pray for a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit and reformation of the Church. Pray that the Swiss becomes spiritually rich to use her resources to be a blessing to other nations.

Sat. June 10: Andorra — Praise God for the evangelical ministries and churches making impact for the Lord in Andorra. Though having 90.6% of 79,000 population as Christian, yet materialism holds Andorra in a tight grip as true

People's Liberation Army/Movement in opposition (SPLA/M-10) in Upper Nile State seems unabated. Pray for ceasefire and restoration of peace to this new Nation. Pray for the churches in South Sudan to remain united and model peace and reconciliation to a watching world. Pray that the people of South Sudan will embrace the Gospel and eschew all ethnic hatred.

Mon. June 05: Benin — Although this nation's democracy is considered stable, the government, like many in Africa is riddled with corruption. One-third of the population lives in poverty, and barely one-third is literate — one of the world's least developed nations. Pray for visionary and God-fearing leaders. Ask God to set free through the Gospel those who practice voodoo and witchcraft. Pray that the Bible and Christian literature be translated in many languages for those still without the Scripture.

Tues. June 06: Burundi — Thank God for the gradual return of peace to Burundi after the ethnic and political violence of the past. The last election in the country saw a largely peaceful and successful transition from one President to the next, yet corruption remains a challenge in the country. Pray for a change that last, which only the Gospel brings. Pray for more Christian workers in the rural areas, where refugees are returning after years of political and ethnic horrors. Pray for genuine love and peaceful coexistence between the Hutus and the Tutsis.

Wed. June 07: Somalia — Somalia, one of the poorest countries in Sub-Saharan Africa, still faces many challenges as it remains fragile. Terrorist groups' attacks are threatening the government and limiting its capacity to implement effective developmental policies. Ask

region despite regular practice of their ethnic religion. Pray that the Lord would thrust out faithful and anointed workers to the Guruntum of about 16,000 people with 4% Christian. They rely on farming and raising livestock for their livelihood. Ask God to provide abundant rain and harvest to bring them to the knowledge and acceptance of Christ. Pray for spiritual hunger for truth and righteousness for Guruntum elders.

Tues. Jan. 24: Boko, Kebbi State — The Boko people are located on the fringes of Nigeria's boarder shared with Benin Republic and in Niger State. They are about 70,000 people having Islam as the dominant religion though their proximity to Benin Republic has wielded a strong influence of Animism on the people. Thank God for the kingdom labours that have produced some fruits among them. Ask God to breathe afresh upon the work among the people and deliver them from the grip of Animism and Islam.

Wed. Jan. 25: MSL Board Members — Pray for an increase of God's grace upon all the members of the Board. Ask the Lord to bless them and their families and to also prosper the works of their hands. Pray that they will retain the knowledge of God and always remember His faithfulness upon their lives, never to give up on their commitment to make Christ known in the nations.

Thurs. Jan. 26: MSL National Council — Pray that the Lord will prosper the work under the leadership of the current Council Chairman to take MSL to greater height, making great progress and flourishing. Also pray that the Lord will equip the team with wisdom, knowledge and

understanding of the MSL vision to bear lasting fruit. Pray for God's continuous blessings be upon their families.

Fri. Jan. 27: MSL International Office — Pray for safety and fruitfulness as the MSL International Office staff engage the ministry work in Africa and beyond. Pray that MSL work in USA, UK, Gambia and Kenya will receive a fresh touch of revival as the Lord raises new members and also orchestrate enduring partnerships with churches and ministries that will advance His kingdom. Ask God for wisdom and grace for the International Director to align with the fast changing approaches to ministry in this 21st century.

Sat. Jan. 28: MSL Staff (Missionaries) — Praise God for the perseverance and courage exhibited by MSL staff despite family and ministry challenges. Due to shortage in manpower, the workload is much on the current staff. Pray that the God of harvest would send faithful labourers to join the MSL workforce. Ask the Lord to grant wisdom, grace, strength and protection to the staff as they go about laboring both in the office and the fields, mobilizing the body of Christ towards the accomplishment of the Great Commission.

Sun. Jan. 29: Muslim Background Believers (MBBs) — Thank God for the spiritual and numerical growth of the MBBs around the world. Pray for continuous grace, protection, focus and sustenance for them as they wax stronger in faith and the knowledge of the Lord Jesus Christ. Pray for strength to overcome obstacles that might come their ways and for courage for them to

Thurs. June 01: Nigeria — Thank God for keeping Nigeria united despite all the odds, for not allowing the country to be overrun by forces of evil. Using Joel 2:19, ask for restoration of all that Nigeria has lost to corruption, insecurity, and all wickedness of men. Pray for a fully missionized Nigerian Church as a force towards completing the remaining harvest.

Fri. June 02: Liberia — The country is rich in natural resources which include iron ore, diamonds, gold, fertile soil, fishery and forestry. However, the economic potential of these assets remains largely untapped and majority wallow in poverty. Pray that the government's pro-poor agenda for prosperity will transform the fortune of the country and the people. Pray for peaceful, credible and transparent elections come October this year 2023. Pray for a spiritually re-awakened Church in Liberia.

Sat. June 03: Comoros — Comoros is densely populated with approximately 465 inhabitants per km/square. The high population density places pressure on natural resources and the environment, even as nearly one-fourth of the population is extremely poor. Pray for a visionary and God-fearing leader for this country's stability and prosperity for all. Pray that the Gospel infiltrates every Island, regardless of restriction and mounting persecution. Pull down the stronghold of false teachings of occult and Islam in the country.

Sun. June 04: South Sudan — The growing tension in South Sudan between South Sudan People's Defense Force (SSPF) and Sudan

Deuteronomy 30:15-19, pray that Christian homes will always choose to love God and walk in His ways rather than turning away to something else and that they exercise their authority in Christ to influence their communities for Kingdom advancement. Pray that God will shield faithful homes from the wiles of the devil and show mercy to homes still wallowing in darkness.

Tues. May 30: 10/40 Window — The 10/40 window is often called "The Resistant Belt" as most governments in this area are officially or unofficially opposed to Christian work of any kind within their borders. Pray that the Holy Spirit will hover the 10/40 window and cause the closed doors against the Gospel to be widely opened. Ask the Lord of the harvest to send and equip faithful labourers to flood this window with the light of Christ to improve the quality of life of the people.

Wed. May 31: The Body of Christ in Nigeria — A great and effective door has opened to the Nigeria Church as the world's eye is on Africa for world evangelization in which Nigeria is key. Pray against many adversaries besieging the body of Christ in Nigeria and ask for repentant hearts for Church leaders not prioritizing reaching the Unreached Peoples and discipleship. Pray that God should reveal His kingdom and redemptive plans to every Christian in Nigeria.

boldly share the Good news in love to their persecutors and their family members.

Mon. Jan. 30: Missions Mobilizers — The unpleasant happenings around the world such as lawlessness, wars, social vices, economic retrogression and natural disasters are impacting mission endeavours negatively. Praise God that in all these, the Church is still matching on. Though there are about 2.4 billion Christians globally, only 4.19 million are full-time Christian workers (Gordon Conwell, 2021). Therefore, ask God to raise more anointed, faithful and well-equipped Missions Mobilizers to blow the trumpet in Zion for every Christian to live a life on a mission with God. Pray for grace and fruitfulness on the efforts of Missions Mobilizers.

Tues. Jan. 31: The Universal Church — The world is made up of 17,432 people groups (7.9 billion people), of which 7,070 (3.74 billion) are reached, 2,960 are unevangelized (819 million) and 7,402 are unreached (3.28 billion) according to Worldometer and JoshuaProject, Nov. 2021. The Church remains God's plan to reconciling the world to Himself. Pray that the universal Church will be united in spirit and purpose. Using 2Cor. 9:17-20, pray that everyone in Christ will be a true ambassador for Christ, taking responsibility for the work of reconciliation.

FEBRUARY

Wed. Feb. 01: Nigeria Youths — Youths are the strength and future of a nation and there is need to invest in them (ethics, values, character and

education). Statistics has it that 45% - 48% of Nigeria population are youths. Pray that the Holy Spirit will move into primary and secondary schools, polytechnics, universities and other institutions to dominate all oppressive demons causing decadence in the academic world. Ask God to break and convict the hearts of these young ones with the things that break His heart.

Thurs. Feb. 02: Madagascar — This land of riches fights a battle with poverty. Its rich environment houses unique plant and animal species and a unique mix of ethnicities but most people live on an average of less than \$1 US/day. Pray for leadership that will serve the people well and development that lifts people out of poverty. Many churches appear to be spiritually dead with numerical decline; pray for a new move of the Holy Spirit to reawaken these churches with such a strong legacy.

Fri. Feb. 03: Lesotho — Lesotho faces great challenges. The HIV infection rate is among the highest in the world (23.2%). Family breakdown, poverty, unemployment and limited access to water frustrate daily life. Pray for wise leadership and creative ways to improve quality of life. Pray for fruitful ministry among the less reached due to isolation and for Scripture Union sharing God's word with young people through school groups.

Sat. Feb. 04: Tanzania — Thank God that Tanzania remains an "island of peace" amidst troubled nations. Christianity (54.1%) is the largest religion in Tanzania, still, witchcraft mixes in with both Christianity and Islam. People living with albinism in Tanzania are attacked, killed or mutilated because of superstitions

Fri. May 26: MSL Chapters and Partners — Thank God for the fruitful efforts of Chapter members and partners towards accomplishing the MSL vision; pray that they would keep the fire burning by supporting missionaries and mission projects. Ask God to make them salt and light in their different locations to attract many to God and His mission that the Lord will equip them more for His service. Pray for safety and sustenance for them and their family members.

Sat. May 27: MSL New Frontiers — Thank God for the impact of MSL New Frontiers in the last 8 years in mobilizing young Nigerian Christians to be on a mission with God. Ask God to raise and groom more youths passionate about His Kingdom through the New Frontiers activities and use them to fulfil His purpose in this nation and beyond. Pray for God's grace, favour, safety and sustenance for the Youth Mobilisation Officer as he anchors this arm of the Ministry.

Sun. May 28: MSL Silver Jubilee — Hallelujah! MSL is 25 years this year. Praise God for this milestone in the history of missions in Nigeria. Pray for renewed strength and fresh anointing on everyone connected to MSL to engage the future with vigour and grace towards the accomplishment of MSL vision. Pray that the anniversary celebration later in the year will encourage and galvanize MSL staff, Chapter members, partnering agencies, adopted field missionaries and all connected to the vision to be more productive and fruitful.

Mon. May 29: Christian Homes — God and the devil are both interested in families, the unit of

Ask the Lord to equip their leaders with sufficient grace, strength and wisdom to render Christ-like leadership. Pray that their labour will yield remarkable results among the Unreached Peoples. Also pray for good health and protection for all their leaders and missionaries.

Wed. May 24: Grace Foundation Inland Missions (GFIM) — The Home of Grace and the School of Cross-Cultural Missions are critical arms of their work. Pray for the students to be well discipled to fit into the plans and purpose of God. Pray for funds to meet up with the challenges of hyperinflation and pray for wisdom and fresh unction for the leadership team of the Ministry.

Thurs. May 25: Global Outreach For Christ International (GOCI) — Thank God for expanding the work of the mission agency as she opens new fields in some parts of Nigeria. Pray that God will cause the work to grow in those fields. The present challenge of banditry in Nigeria affected some missionaries and mission fields; pray that the missionaries will be encouraged with their faith strengthened.

related to black magic practice. Pray the government will be bold to confront evil and wise to bring community harmony and religious freedom. Pray against poverty, hunger and human rights abuses prevalence in Tanzania.

Sun. Feb. 05: DR Congo — There have been frequent reports of killings of civilians, destruction of property, widespread sexual violence and other breaches of humanitarian and human rights law, causing hundreds of thousands to flee their homes. Pray against the spirit of war, misunderstanding, ethnic and regional conflicts, destruction, and killings. Pray for peace over DRC and that numerous armed groups will see the need to drop arms and embrace peace and love.

Mon. Feb. 06: Libya — After the fall of long-time ruler Gaddafi in 2011, Libya became a land divided by civil war among different factions. Radical Islamists such as ISIS and smaller local groups took advantage of the chaos to seize control of some towns. Ask for God's mercy upon this land and the people. Pray for a resolution to the issue of governance, for the rebuilding of infrastructure that enables communities to thrive and for an opening of these lands and people to the Gospel. Pray for creative and effective radio and television programmes with the means to disciple responsive listeners and for protection for those who respond.

Tues. Feb. 07: Zimbabwe — The Zimbabwean government is accused of suppressing freedom of press and speech. Women are often seen as inferior, treated as objects and viewed in subordinate roles in history and philosophy.

Zimbabwe experiences high rates of domestic and sexual violence. Pray against human rights violations and the spirit of impunity, where some people are above the law. Ask God to put an end to the ill-treatment, domestic and sexual violence against women, assumed to be normal in the society.

Wed. Feb. 08: Serbia — Serbia is a nation with a public relations problem and Evangelicals in Serbia face many difficulties. The recent religion law creates difficulty for all new religious groups and many do not live out their faith. Pray for revival and a mighty work of God for the healing and redemptive transformation of Serbian identity. Christian mission agencies find it hard to establish long-term ministry. Pray that openings be increased and long-term workers be called.

Thurs. Feb. 09: Lithuania — Republic of Lithuania has population of 2,689,864 (according to Operation World) with 85% Christian and 15% non-religious. It is the last European nation to be Christianized, however, substance abuse, suicide and trafficking of women for prostitution, all damage the social foundations. Pray that there will be sound teaching of the word of God and that negative perceptions about the Church might change. Also, pray that the Catholic Church uses her significant influence to draw people to Christ and that God will bring massive social change through His people.

Fri. Feb. 10: Montenegro — Republic of Montenegro is a small country of about 598,000 people but it has great potential. However, it must avoid the hatred among ethnic/religious communities that cripples most nations of the

Fri. May 19: Global Anchor Partners (GAP)

— Praise God for the fruitful partnership the ministry is enjoying in reaching the Unreached Peoples through evangelism, mobilization, training and networking. Pray for fruitfulness in the ministry's work in Nigeria, Mali, Cameroon, Gambia and Niger Republic and for availability of sufficient Bibles for the trainings and discipleship programmes conducted across

various fields.

Sat. May 20: Christian Missionary Foundation (CMF) — in the Southeast, CMF is involved in creating mission awareness in Christian institutions, trainings, partnering and mobilisation of churches for outreaches to the unreached communities. The ministry carries out Medical Mission Outreaches and Welfare Missions in partnership with churches and ministries in the zone. Pray for supplies such as drugs, eye glasses, film projectors, laptops, cameras and bus for mobility as they reach out to Owaza and Umuode in Abia State and Oweredji in Ebonyi State. Ask God to raise more committed supporters for CMF.

Sun. May 21: CAPRO Bible Translation and Literacy (BT&L) — The goal of BT&L is to assist translation of Scripture into mother tongues for autonomous propagation of the Gospel among 7 Unreached People Groups by 2024. Thank God for every staff of BT&L and for successes in various projects it has embarked on. Pray for God's help in accomplishing this goal and that the targeted Unreached People will be able to read and write in their mother tongues.

Mon. May 22: GO International — GO Int'l will be 40 years next month, praise God for His faithfulness in and through the Ministry. Pray for

Mon. May 15: Nauru — Thousands of miles away from any other land, the tiny Island of Nauru sits isolated in the Pacific. It is said to be home to just over 10,000 people and the smallest republic. Using Psalms 9:18, entreat the Lord for provision for the 90% population of the unemployed in this predominantly Christian Nation. Ask God to grant hope to the people from the despairing economic condition and poverty. Also pray that the believers will persevere; trusting in Jesus Christ.

Tues. May 16: Nigeria Evangelical Mission Institute (NEMI) — Pray that the training institute will become a focal point in training for Cross-cultural ministry and in facilitating leadership, empowerment and human development of member agencies nationwide. Pray for the provision of all they need to remain efficient and effective in God's agenda for the Great Commission.

Wed. May 17: Nigeria Fellowship of Evangelical Students (NIFES) – Appreciate God for the efforts of NIFES in reaching out to students on various campuses with the Gospel. Using her as a point of contact to other students' ministries, ask God to endue them with more grace and wisdom to reach out to students on various campuses across the nation more effectively with the Gospel.

Thurs. May 18: Pleroma Missions — Appreciate God for His love and grace upon the ministry and the missionaries. Pray that the ancient doors preventing the people from seeing the light of God in the engaged fields be shattered and they be set free to serve the Christ. Also, pray that God will provide for and unite the missionaries for more efficient Kingdom service.

Balkan region. Pray for Montenegro to be a just, peaceful, and corruption-free nation which enjoys ethnic harmony. Pray for the move of the Holy Spirit in the Orthodox Church and that people will seek the truth of Christ. The evangelical community is tiny but multiplying, ask God to use them to reach out to the remaining Unreached Peoples of Albanian, Bosniak and Egyptian Balkan in Montenegro.

Sat. Feb. 11: Liechtenstein — Liechtenstein is a small country between Switzerland and Austria. It has population of about 38,000 with 79% Christian (mostly Catholics), 13% Non-religious and 7% Muslim. Though expatriates represent several Christian confessions, Non-religious and Muslims are growing rapidly. Ask the Lord to envision Christian experts to get more involved in evangelising and discipling the indigenes. Though they are well off financially, pray that Liechtensteiners will think about the afterlife and begin to ask questions that will bring personal encounters with Christ.

Sun. Feb. 12: Singapore — The Church in Singapore has grown steadily since 1970, especially among evangelical and charismatic groups. Praise God for the positive impact of the Church in Singapore. Singaporean society is built on dedicated labour, discipline and self-reliance and materialism has noticeably increased. Pray that the admirable strengths of Singapore might not in themselves become idols. Pray that churches gain a passion and burden to reach the less-reached peoples in Singapore.

Mon. Feb. 13: Kosovo — Kosovo has a population of about 1,740,00 with 80% Muslim and 10% Christian. Praise God for the very small but growing evangelical Church from 80

believers in 1998 to 2,000 now. Pray for unity among believers and continued growth in numbers and spiritual maturity. Many Kosovars are quite nominally Muslim, but extremism is on the rise. Pray that religious hatred might be quelled and that Muslims would see beyond ethno-religious hatred to Jesus Christ, to whom they are precious.

Tues. Feb. 14: Canada — Christian influence on Canadian society declined across the last century. The non-religious population grew the most as Christians became more liberal in their beliefs about God and the Bible, leaving the Church, but other religions grew quickly through immigration and high birth rates. Pray for a vibrant move of God in the declining denominations and that Canadian Christians would be more concerned with being loving witnesses to the Gospel than with political agendas and culture wars.

Wed. Feb. 15: Arabs — Arab people are an ethnic group, mainly inhabiting the Arab world in Western Asia, North Africa, the Horn of Africa and the western Indian Ocean Islands. 93% of Arabs are Muslims, while Arab Muslims comprise only 20% of the global Muslim population. Ask the Lord of harvest to open the doors of these regions to the preaching of the Gospel. Ask the Holy Spirit to call and equip people who are willing to go and share the love of Christ with the Arabs and that strong local churches would be raised among them.

Thurs. Feb. 16: Omega Hybrid of Four Square Gospel Church, Asokoro — After the retirement of the Omega Project 2 Chairman as the Senior Pastor in June 2021, came a new

Fri. May 12: Bolivia — Even though the country is said to be rich in mineral and energy resources, it is one of the poorest countries in South America. Pray for a forthright leadership that will harness the country's potentials for a strong economy and bring an end to the abject poverty and address the plight of the homeless. Ask God for a strong discipleship movement that will equip believers to stand against false doctrines and immoral lifestyles. Praise God for increase in the Evangelicals in recent time; pray that this increase results in the evangelization of more Unreached People in the land.

Sat. May 13: Argentina — Praise God for the rise in evangelical Christians, growing from 1 million in 1980 to over 4.5 million by 2020. One of the largest Unreached Peoples in Argentina is the urban professionals, especially those in Buenos Aires where one-third of the nation lives. Pray for the many Christians present in Buenos Aires to gain a passion for sharing the Gospel across social, economic and cultural boundaries. Pray that the Argentinian Church would support the Argentina missionaries being sent to the foreign Muslim areas.

Sun. May 14: Palau — Thank God for the Palauan tourism potentials and growth, as there are increasing numbers of people visiting the tourist centre. About 96% of Palauan population consider themselves Christians, with 42% Roman Catholics and 26% Protestants — including growing Evangelical segment. Pray for indigenous believers to be raised as Evangelicals/missionaries to the smaller Unreached Island communities. Pray that the large number of adults imprisoned by addictions to alcohol and drugs be delivered. Pray that

oppressive dictatorships. However, through these tragedies of political corruption and natural disasters, God is at work, softening the hearts of the Nicaraguans. Pray for the right government to seek the good of the impoverished people. Pray for the Church to proclaim the Gospel and seek justice for the oppressed. Pray for Gospel-centered unity among the various Christian denominations in the country.

Wed. May 10: Antigua and Barbuda — While slavery was abolished in 1834, the Islands continue in their history of social stratification based on race, with the majority Afro-Antiguans and Barbadians on bottom. Pray that the two local Christian radio stations might be powerful influences in pulling down the walls of unhealthy race and stratification differences. Antiguans are somewhat Christians by background but complacency prevails in the face of serious moral and spiritual challenges. Pray for revival that galvanizes Christians to prayer and for involvements that impact their society.

Thurs. May 11: Paraguay — Paraguay is often referred to as "Corazon de America" or "Heart of America". It is a beautiful country of diverse landscapes and people, in the center of South America and can be referred to as a Christian country with most of the 95% Christian population being Roman Catholics. Using 1Corinthians 10:17, pray for increased number of Evangelicals and the unity of the Church in the country. Pray that the spirit of superstition be defeated and that Gospel will take root and grow in the remaining minority groups. Pray for government and political leaders to embrace God's righteousness in place of corruption.

Pray for divine protection, provision, grace and spiritual growth for all Omega Hybrid partners and that the fruitful work of mission support will keep flourishing.

Fri. Feb. 17: Calvary Ministries (CAPRO) — Pray that God will fill every CAPRO staff, partners and friends with the Holy Spirit and that they will be effective witnesses for Christ. Using Acts 1:1, pray for the trainers in CAPRO School of Mission that they will be effectively equipped for the work. Pray that in all areas of life, trainees will not just learn but live the life of Christ in all they do.

Sat. Feb. 18: CMF Diaspora Mission (DM) and Fulani work — Christian Missionary Foundation is engaging the Fulanis in various fields within and outside Nigeria. Sun. Feb. 19: Cave Missions — Praise God for His continuous supply of grace and resources for the ministry's endeavors. Pray that the leadership and missionaries of Cave Missions will always do the will of God. Ask God to breathe upon their labour among the Bauchi, Ura, Kambari, Dukawa, Ganagana, Gbagyi and Kupa peoples and grant abiding fruitfulness to all their efforts. Pray that God will bless the ministry's

partnership with local churches and denominations within their mission fields.

Mon. Feb. 20: Zion World Prayer and Missions — Political unrest and insecurity have adversely impacted the Ministry's activities in some fields in Northeast and North Central Nigeria and in West and Central Africa. Pray against banditry attacks and threats to farmers in Nigeria, causing food scarcity and for political stability in Burkina Faso, Cameron and Chad. Ask God for peace and protection of Zion World missionaries and their families working in difficult regions. Pray for divine provision for all their projects and for the new converts in their entire fields to grow in faith in the face of persecutions.

Tues. Feb. 21: Missions Consult — Praise God for the miraculous escape of the Missions Consult Director from the den of the kidnappers sometime last year. Pray for divine protection and provision for the leaders, staff/missionaries, partners and their families. Ask the Lord to increase the faith of the staff/missionaries to be more dedicated to the ministry's vision and that God will thrust more faithful labourers and partners to join the Ministry.

Wed. Pray that the Good news be received with open hearts.

Sun. May 07: Tunisia — Praise God that Tunisia constitutionally allows freedom of religion. However, pray that the political and religious authorities will remove every form of restrictions against the Christian faith and the Gospel. Tunisia is 99% Muslim with 12 of 15 Unreached People Groups; pray that continued intercession might break through the centuries-old barriers to the Gospel. More than 6.5 million tourists visit Tunisia each year, pray for a ministry to Muslim tourists and also for sensitive sharing opportunities for Christians who come as tourists.

Mon. May 08: El Salvador — Praise God for peace enjoyed since the end of the civil war in 1992. El Salvador has a population of about 6.5 million people with 94.6% Christian; using Psalms 67:5, pray for Evangelicals to maintain their spiritual fervour, cultivating a passion for reaching the lost and discipline others for service. Ask God for effective methods of reaching the youths, as many have turned to gangs and violent acts and pray that the government engages them positively.

Tues. May 09: Nicaragua — The story of Nicaragua is that of volcanic eruptions,

for healthy marriages and sexual purity among the population. Pray for increased evangelical presence and impact in the land.

Wed. May 03: Egypt — Elements of tension arising from the Arab Spring still manifest from time to time. The absence of independent media poses a concern to the Christian community. Pray for a government that serves God's purpose, restrain from evil, punish crime for what it is, and enable peaceful and quiet lives among the citizenry. Pray for grace and revival in the majority Coptic Church amidst oppression.

Thurs. May 04: Angola — Ignorance of the Bible, false beliefs, witchcraft and animistic practices hold sway; polluting lives in the country. Pray for the desperately needed Christian workers to hear God's call and serve in Angola. Pray for safe removal of millions of landmines still killing and maiming many especially children. Pray also that Christian help leads the way in developing the country by alleviating poverty, healing trauma and reconciliation programmes.

Fri. May 05: South Africa — Thank God for a strong legacy of Biblical Christianity, hosting of many prayer networks, as well theological institutions in the country. South Africa is however associated with immorality, poverty, injustice, corruption, xenophobia and violent crimes. Pray therefore that she gets a government that will root out corruption, oppose wickedness and uphold righteousness. Pray for greater impact of their support to the mission work among Asian migrants and ask the Lord to bring many migrant Muslims in

UK to Christ. Pray that MSL UK Chapter members will express Kingdom values 24/7 that will salt and light up their communities, drawing unbelievers to Christ.

Mon. Feb. 27: Youths Globally — Reports show that there is a significant decline in the number of youth attendance in religious gatherings globally especially in Europe. Many young people are exposed to ungodly programmes and activities that take them farther from God. Ask God for mercy to liberate those entrapped under the yoke of drugs, substance abuse, immoral habits, false religions and ideologies and for grace to escape snares the evil one sets on their path. Pray for Holy Ghost baptism and power upon young people to love God and go about doing good works.

Tues. Feb. 28: Ministers of the Gospel — Using 1Corinthians 10:12-13, pray against self (lust of the eyes and flesh and pride of life), demonic attacks against the consecration of true Ministers of the Gospel globally and ask God to lead them not into temptation but deliver them from the evil one. Pray for restoration for those that have strayed from their calling and that they will be good shepherds of the sheep God committed to them.

MARCH

Wed. March 01: Nigeria — Nigeria's unity has survived, almost miraculously, despite countless threats. The cumulative effects of ancient tribal rivalries, Muslim conquests, the bitter Biafra war of 1967-70 and heightened religious tensions have left deep scars. Pray for healing and reconciliation; pray also for leadership that will

good education and availability of Scripture in sign language and other languages they can understand.

Sun. April 30: The Body of Christ in Africa — The world has its eyes on Africa for the world evangelization as it is a home to most Christians (667 million) in the world. Using Luke 23:26, thank God for the prophetic destiny of Africa in accomplishing the work of reconciliation and pray that the African Church will bear the cross of the world evangelisation laid on her after Christ. Pray the older Christians will be intentional about investing in the younger Christians, equipping them for the work of ministry and that the body of Christ in Africa be united.

MAY

Mon. May 01: Nigeria — Praise God for His faithfulness to Nigerians during the general elections. Using Psalms 72:3, pray for a peaceful democratic transition/handover in Nigeria this month. Pray for wisdom for the new leadership at all levels and for grace to respond to the yearnings of Nigerians. Decree peace, unity and prosperity in Nigeria henceforth.

Tues. May 02: Swaziland — Swaziland, now known as the Kingdom of Eswatini was renamed in 2018 during her 50th Independence anniversary — a landlocked country in Southern Africa of about 1.2million people with 84.1% Christian. Eswatini rates one of the highest in teenage prostitution and HIV/AIDS prevalence in the world. Pray for revival in the Swazi Church and pray that those bound by ancestral worship and occult will find freedom in Jesus Christ. Pray

results. Pray that MSL Nigeria will provide good leadership and encouragement for MSL leadership in other countries.

Thurs. April 27: MSL Oyo State Operations — Thank God for the progress made in the functionality of Oyo State Council and for positive responses from churches in partnering with missionaries. Pray that persons of peace to open more doors for mobilization in the State be mobilized. Pray that Olodo Chapter in Ibadan becomes very active and fruitful towards the adopted field and the birth of more Chapters. Pray for fresh anointing and apostolic passion for mobilization and provision for the State Mobilisation Officer to effectively engage the State.

Fri. April 28: Missionaries/Christian Workers — Ministers in the marketplace are so strategic in influencing the world for the establishment of God's kingdom through living out kingdom values that reveal Christ to all peoples. Thank God for the great awakening going on in the body of Christ globally, involving of every Christian in missions. Pray that Christian Ministers will focus on the Lord and not the fruit of the labour. Pray for wisdom, grace and resources for workers to penetrate every hostile group or community resistant to the Gospel.

Sat. April 29: The Physically Challenged/Destitutes — Praise God for the lives of these special people and ask that the love of God will continually fill their hearts. Ask God to protect, guide and supply their needs as they deploy their gifts, talents and skills to benefit mankind and advance God's Kingdom. Pray for necessary trainings for their leaders, access to

serve to reconcile and unite rather than to embitter and divide. Pray for the right balance between caution and decisiveness in addressing extremist Muslim agitation in the North, armed militias in the disgruntled oil-rich Southeast. Pray for prudence and ambition in economic development and in combatting poverty.

Thurs. March 02: Niger — This Muslim land and the people are open for the Gospel. Many previously Unreached People Groups now have their first believers and pastors (converts from Islam) lead most congregations. Still, Islam dominates the land and strict aggressive Muslim groups increase. Pray that Niger remains open for Christian mission, and that the Lord would remove every barrier to the knowledge of Him. There is a growing contribution to missions by Nigeria and Brazil, pray for sensitivity in helping small, young indigenous churches and their leaders to maturity to effectively evangelize and disciple their own people.

Fri. March 03: Malawi — Malawi remains a stable and peaceful land in a region troubled by wars and violence. The grip of poverty hampers development and increasing activity of Islam is a significant issue as over 80% of the Yao are Muslim. Praise God for the peace that allows Christian ministry and national development to continue. Pray for leaders in Malawi, most of whom are church members, to act with wisdom, humility and long-term planning on biblical principles and for a persistent, loving witness to Muslims throughout Malawi.

Sat. March 04: Central African Republic (CAR) — The CAR was one of the world's most evangelized nations, but the upheavals here and in nearby Chad and Sudan have reversed the

progress made. Pray for all the denominations in CAR to send students for missionary training and pray that those with training would resist the pressure to serve as a city pastor but instead go to the Unreached. Ask God to equip the few Christians to reach out with the Gospel to the Runga (90% Muslim), the Sara Kaba (50% Animist) and the Gula/Kara (65% Muslim).

Sun. March 05: Ghana — Ghana enjoys a rich Christian tradition! Young people remains key in the efforts to bring revival to Ghana as over 40% of the population are under age 15, but specific efforts to reach them are insufficient, despite their spiritual openness in major cities. Thank God for many churches emerging and for the vibrant spiritual life of the traditional denominations. Pray for the conversion and discipleship of a new generation of Christians that will make impact in the religious, cultural, political and economic life of Ghanaians. Traditional African practices present the greatest challenge to the Christians in Ghana. Pray for a clear break from all bondages to charms and the occult.

Mon. March 06: Equatorial Guinea — Equatorial Guinea faces an unusual political and economic situation. Large oil reserves made a small minority rich, while most of the people do not benefit from such wealth. Pray for economic justice and correct stewardship. The oil boom brings in foreigners, both Christians and Muslims. Pray that expatriate believers might engage with the spiritual and physical needs of the nation and that foreign companies would do business in ways that benefit the local people. Pray that the 85% who claim Christianity without being born again will hear and respond to the true gospel of Jesus Christ.

Tues. March 07: Mauritius — This complex multi-ethnic and multi-religious society makes evangelism a challenge; pray for great wisdom and discernment among Christians. The Hinduization of government and culture, as well as strong ancestral and ethnic ties make it difficult for Indians to become believers. However, large numbers of Hindus are coming to Jesus Christ through bold witness of Evangelical/Pentecostal churches. Praise God for this Church growth and pray that the body of Christ in Mauritius will reflect the beautiful multi-cultural nature of God's Kingdom. Ask God for fruitfulness in the efforts of ministries such as YWAM, IFES, Cru, CEF and others reaching out to students and children creatively.

Wed. March 08: Chad — There are more Unreached Peoples in Chad than in any other African country which makes her least-evangelized. The former President's 30 years rule (1991 – 2021) was known for corruption, cronyism and tribalism which made Chad to remain one of the world's poorest nations. Pray for a government that will lead with integrity, transparency, justice and balanced concern for all the regions and peoples of Chad. Pray for missionaries with a pioneering spirit (perseverance in language and culture acquisition and endurance) to minister in Chad. Pray that Christians will learn to reach out to the Muslims around them.

Thurs. March 09: Indonesia — A spiritual conflict rages for Indonesia of 276,361,788 people with 15.9% Christian and 80.3% Muslim. Ancient and strong occult powers seek to oppose the influence of the Gospel, while modern Muslim stratagems seek to eliminate Christianity and the spread of the good news. Pray

specifically for the binding of these powers and for continued growth of the Church in the midst of intense opposition and growing persecution. Pray for Christians to reach out to Sumatra, the largest unevangelized Island on earth with the love of Christ.

Fri. March 10: Azerbaijan — God raised an Azeri Church, even amidst trials! Only 40 known Azeri believers lived in the country in 1991. Now there may possibly be as many as 10,000, with majority in Baku. Praise God for the growth of the Church and pray for good fellowship among all the believers. The Church faces intensifying opposition, even as it grows. Pray that Christian witness to the majority Muslim (87.6%) population be with humility, wisdom and love. Also, ask God for stability and a genuine will of government to make peace in and around Azerbaijan.

Sat. March 11: Macau, China — Macau is the first Christian territory in Asia to become non-Christian since the Muslim conquest in West Asia over 600 years ago. Many now follow Buddhism, Daoism or traditional Chinese religions. Pray for believers to win back this territory for the Saviour. Gambling is a religion that is epidemic in Macau; pray against addiction, materialism, greed, prostitution and substance abuse taking on a massive scale in the gambling industry. Ask God to raise labourers to minister to gambling addicts and prosper the efforts of the groups addressing these resultant issues.

Sun. March 12: Finland — Finland is largely a secular society, though Christians number 84% of the 5,548,361 population. Strong belief in the power of human reason and rejection of

supernatural things now dominate the society. Pray for spiritual breakthrough that would cause people to seek the Lord. Pray that the unity the Free Churches (both Pentecostal and non-Pentecostal), Charismatic Renewal and Lutherans are enjoying currently will continue and ask for cooperation in evangelism and missions among these various bodies.

Mon. March 13: Cyprus — This is a nation where 94.4% of the population are Christians yet, church attendance is largely practiced by rural dwellers and the older generation. Therefore, pray for revival that would lead the people to seek God earnestly and be closely drawn to Him. Also, pray for sustained growth of evangelical churches among the English-speaking, Russian, Filipino, Sri Lankan and Iranian communities. Pray for their active and effective witness to their own communities and to the indigenous peoples.

Tues. March 14: Bosnia and Herzegovina — This is a country on the Balkan Peninsula in Southeastern Europe with 3,263,459 population of 18 people groups with Islam (54.2%) as the largest religion. It has a tragic history of violence as hatred among ethnic groups appears impossible to resolve, making young people desiring to leave. Ask God to bring true reconciliation and unity among the groups and pray for a new generation of Bosnians to stay and lead their nation into bright future. Ask God to strengthen the 41% Christian to reach out to the unevangelized peoples and engage the remaining 3 (the Deaf, Albanian and Turk) Unreached Groups.

Wed. March 15: Ukraine — Ukraine's location as a gateway between East and West puts her in a vulnerable position, as the last 15 years have shown. As of 2022, Russian forces are alleged to be massing; tensions increase and conflict abate. Pray that God ruins the plans of those seeking war, and that peace prevails. Pray also for wisdom in the face of pressure for Ukraine's leaders and freedom from fear for her people. Church growth is somewhat limited by current needs for training, infrastructure, adequate facilities and active input from lay Christians. Pray for a mentality of abundance and generosity that provides for the material needs of Church growth without too much recourse to foreign funds.

Thurs. March 16: Northeast Nigeria — The introduction of Shari'a law in Northern Muslim States is a direct challenge to the federal government especially in the Northeast. It is an open door to human rights abuses and the further infiltration of Nigeria by extremists. Pray for the intrinsic cruelty and injustices of Shari'a to be exposed and for those seeking moral order and social righteousness to find it in the practice of biblical principles under the authority of Christ. Ask the Lord to curtail the danger to national stability and a threat to Christian ministry in Northeastern States.

Fri. March 17: The Bassa-Gbagyigala, Abuja — Thank God for the numerical growth of the Gbagyigala Church; pray against nominalism, syncretism and tribal conflicts that cause division in the Church. Also, pray against the spread of false religions in the land. Ask the Lord to help the people to uphold the authority of the Scripture above traditional practices that are opposed to the word of God such as polygamy.

Pray that the Gbagyigala Church in the Federal Capital Territory would experience a mighty outpouring of the Holy Spirit and be envisioned to utilize the unique opportunity they have to reach out to people from Unreached background God has brought to their door steps.

Sat. March 18: The Anca, Taraba State — The Anca is a small group of agricultural people found in Sardauna LGA near the Cameroon border. Ethnic religion is the religious worldview of the people and no Christian materials currently available in Anca language. Pray for the Anca culture to be renewed and enhanced by the Holy Spirit and shaped into a God-centered mold. Pray that the Lord will thrust out compelled workers to nurture a disciple making movement among them and strengthen the faith of the converts to live godly to draw others to the Saviour.

Sun. March 19: The Bade, Yobe and Jigawa States — The Bade people are about 418,000, having Islam (98%) as the largest religious and Christian (2%). They mix animism with Islam; no known evangelical organization is specifically focusing on the Bade with church planting strategies. Ask God to encounter, equip and send Bade believers to disciple those needing the Saviour. Pray for a spiritual hunger among the Bade people that would result to their massive conversion. Pray that God would raise viable indigenous Bade-speaking churches.

Mon. March 20: The Bankalawa, Plateau State — The Bankalawas are about 62,000 people having 70% Islam and 5% Christian. The people are industrious farmers and traders with the traditional fear of spirits and belief in a supreme being. Ask God to reveal His Son Jesus

Christ to the Bankalawas in dreams and visions. Pray that God would raise intercessors to break the bond of fear and stronghold of Islam over the people. Ask God to raise and equip faithful labourers to disciple the Bankalawa believers to reach out to their own people.

Tues. March 21: Denawa, Bauchi State — The Denawa are about 13,000 with majority practising ethnic religions. They originated from Kano and later dispersed to their current location. Praise God for the 5% Denawa believers and ask God to raise translators to make the Scripture available in their mother tongue. Their response to the Gospel is very slow and they lack basic amenities (good roads, portable water and electricity supply). Pray that God will raise mission organizations to adopt this people to meet both their physical and spiritual needs and that they will hunger for Jesus Christ.

Wed. March 22: Fulani, Adamawa State — The Fulani people in Adamawa is about 1.7 million having 97% Islam and 3% Christian. They are proud and teach their young ones to have tribal dignity and are Muslim adherent with animistic beliefs. Pray for compassionate believers to take Christ to the Fulani people. Pray for courage and safety for missionaries in Adamawa with the Gospel of peace and for a church planting movement among the Adamawa Fulani people.

Thurs. March 23: Karekare, Yobe State — The Karekare also known as "Karai-Karai" number about 403,000, having 97.70% Islam and 0.30% Christian. They enjoy music, storytelling and dancing as a form of entertainment and communication. Thank God for the availability of some Bible portions and

Jesus film translated into the Karekare language. Pray for God's kingdom to come and His will be done among the people. Pray for compassionate and spirit filled labourers to cause massive conversion of the Karai-Karai households to Christianity.

Fri. March 24: MSL Nigeria Northern Region — Operations in this region are coordinated by Deputy National Director, Northern Region; pray the Lord to prosper the works of MSL and divinely protect the lives and properties of Christians especially MSL Chapter members in this region. Ask for grace, wisdom, protection and provision for the Coordinator and his team members as they mobilize the body of Christ across Northern States.

Sat. March 25: MSL Nigeria Southern Region — Operations in this region are coordinated by Deputy National Director, Southern Region; pray for fruitfulness in the works of MSL in this region. Ask God to uphold and provide for the Coordinator and his family as he drives the vision of the MSL. Pray also that the Lord will supply all Chapters' members in this region the spiritual, financial and material resources needed to serve God effectively.

Sun. March 26: MSL FCT Operations — Appreciate God for sustaining and protecting the Mobilization Officer (MO) and National Director (ND) who co-labour in the FCT. Thank Him for crowning the resuscitation efforts towards 17 Chapters with positive results despite all odds and for successful hosting of Novel Virtual Conferences. Pray that the Chapters' renewed engagements with the fields will continue with bearing more fruits. Ask God for divine strategies and favour as the MO and ND

catalyze the engagement of the body of Christ in the FCT.

Mon. March 27: MSL Families and Friends—Thank God for His grace and strength on all MSL families and friends to stand with the Ministry in every season. Pray that God will bless the works of their hands and bring them to maturity in Christ. Ask the Lord to protect, provide and sustain them in their supportive roles towards the Kingdom advancement through this Ministry. Pray for MSL staff's spouses as the Holy Spirit gives you inspiration.

Tues. March 28: The Unreached of the World — Of the world's 17,432 people groups, 7,402 (3.28 billion people) are still unreached according to Worldometer, Nov. 2021. They are mostly situated within the 10/40 window and the predominant religions are Islam, Buddhism, Hinduism, Traditional and Non-religious. Ask God to revive His Church and thrust out labourers to reach the Unreached Peoples with the Gospel. Using Habakkuk 2:12-14, make declarations over the Unreached nations and prophesy "Let there be Light". Appreciate God for the love for the Unreached Peoples and for answered prayers.

Wed. March 29: Missionaries/Ministers' Children — Missionaries/Ministers' children are often in danger of spiritual attacks and moral decadence. Ask the Lord to build a hedge around them and replace any stony heart with a heart of flesh. Pray that they be obedient to God's dealings through their parents and others. Jesus Christ wants His name known from generation to generation; ask Him to burden the hearts of these children with the task of the Great Commission. Also ask God to fuel their passion with love for

the Unreached and unevangelized for them to do greater works than their parents in God's vineyard.

Thurs. March 30: Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) — Using Ukrainians and Nigerians as points of contact, pray for comfort, healing and grace for the IDPs to forgive those responsible for their plight. Ask the Lord to raise people to meet their spiritual and physical needs and for speedy restoration of peace and their resettlement. Pray for justice and fairness in the process of caring for and resettling them.

Fri. March 31: Christian Leaders — Pray that the Christian leaders will live exemplary lives (selfless in service and faithful heralds of the Gospel), rightly dividing the Scripture and promoting sound biblical precepts. Ask God to enable these leaders to have positive impact in their respective environments and to grant them wisdom to respond appropriately to the myriad of issues confronting the Church in these perilous times.

APRIL

Sat. April 01: Nigeria — Persecution of the Church in Nigeria unites Christians and drives them to the Lord in prayer, but it also threatens the very core of the Nigerian society and statehood. Praise God for the good impact of persecution and pray for restoration and recovery for those who suffer any form of loss. Pray for forgiveness and for deliverance from the spirit of revenge. Pray also for believers to respond in the most Christ-like way possible and that the

enemies of Christ committing these terrible acts become His followers.

Sun. April 02: Uganda — Families in Uganda are often large. With the lack of finances and resources, larger families are very much likely to fall below poverty line. Ask the Lord to train the hands of Ugandans to profit and raise investors to invest in the country to adequately take care of the families. Poor health also reduces a family's work productivity, causing poverty to be passed down through generations; pray that Ugandan government will invest in the health sector that will guarantee Ugandans access to good health facilities.

Mon. April 03: Sierra Leone — The country now moves forward, away from her recent tragic history. Thank God for the end of 11 years of chaos that claimed up to 100,000 lives, crippled thousands and harmed many in some way. With the highest infant and maternal mortality rates in the world and widespread diseases (malaria, HIV etc.), life expectancy is 47 years. Pray for more attention from the worldwide communities, especially Christians to address the issues and that believers live by faith, depending on Jesus Christ alone for provision, protection and sustenance.

Tues. April 04: Kenya — In Kenya, the research highlighted an increase in violence against women and girl child during Covid-19 lockdowns and curfews. Ask the Lord to heal and comfort the hearts of the victims through forgiveness and reconciliation that brings peace. Pray that government will find sustainable solutions to combat the rising poverty, hunger and crime due to Covid-19. Pray for wisdom and courage for the mission agencies and

organisations reaching out with the love of Christ and discipling Kenyans for the Kingdom advancement.

Wed. April 05: Ethiopia — The country struggles through social, political and economic crises. Corruption increased with economic growth and a wide gap now exists between the few who are rich and the many that are poor. Pray for an end to the terrible violence and devastating civil conflict along ethnic lines. Pray for peace and genuine national unity amongst various ethnic groups and that the church and parachurch ministries would make discipling the next generation a top priority.

Thurs. April 06: Djibouti — This is a country of about 1,094,000 people, made up of 11 people groups of which 7 are Unreached. Mission work is a challenge in this hot, dry, but often humid land and working conditions are extreme. Pray that opportunities to witness Christ will abound for the present ministries in education, public health, literature, Bible translation, literacy and youth work. Pray that these contacts will lead to disciples for Jesus Christ. Ask God to send long-term workers, especially from nearby countries and people groups to reach out to the 97% Muslim in Djibouti.

Fri. April 07: Morocco — Morocco is 99.9% Muslim and 0.1% Christian of 37,344,787 population. Moroccans migrate in large numbers to search for employment, many illegally and dangerously; having significant numbers of them in Europe. Pray for the various agencies reaching out to them in foreign lands. Satellite TV has spread rapidly and is very popular in both urban and rural areas; pray for the production of programmes that are culturally sensitive and

biblically sound and for good reception of these programmes. Pray for positive impact on the lives and worldview of Moroccans.

Sat. April 08: Algeria — Persecution of Christians is intensifying as a reaction to unprecedented Church growth; the future of the Church in Algeria hangs in a balance. Legislation passed has made proselytism a criminal offence. Thank God for the growth of the Algerian Church due to bold witness and evangelism and pray that believers will respond to pressures and threats with faith and perseverance. Pray for discipling of individuals and planting of Arabic and Berber speaking congregations that will channel the Gospel to their homeland.

Sun. April 09: Russia — Millions struggle against poverty and hopelessness as a result of war. There are 78 ethnic minorities (over 13 million in population) considered unreached. Pray for effective partnering of expatriates and Russian ministries to help the people and viable strategies to plant churches among them. Evangelicals in Russia are in a time of both growth and pressure; pray for the unity of the Church and that the current situations will cause the Evangelicals to have success in leading many Russians to Christ.

Mon. April 10: Guyana — Guyana faces various threats and many due to lack of economic opportunities have emigrated, including many of the most talented. Pray for hope to come to Guyana and for the Gospel to transform the society. There is vital and vibrant evangelical witness growing in all levels of society; thank God for this growth and pray God to raise Christian businessmen to grow the economy and spread the Gospel especially among the Urdu

tribe that is 100% Islam and the only Unreached Group in the country.

Tues. April 11: Australia — Australia's precarious environment is overexploited; there is need for better stewardship of the land by the government as failures have resulted not only in staggering environmental destruction but in simmering resentment boiled over into outright anger of the populace. Pray for repentance for careless consumption, rapacious industry and exploitative lifestyles to bring about change and lasting healing for the land and in peoples' mind. Pray that God's people will passionately pursue His mandate of being good stewards of creations and engage their diverse societies in a productive and meaningful way.

Wed. April 12: Myanmar — Myanmar of 54,806,014 population has Buddhism (80%) strongly entrenched among the Burmese majority, as well as the Shan, the Rakhine and the Mon peoples. Thank God for the quiet movement of Buddhist monks to Christ and pray that it keeps spreading, growing and deepening. Pray that Christians (9%) would learn to understand the Buddhist mindset in order to see a breakthrough among the majority and that the limitations on the freedom to function as the Church due to many restrictions be removed.

Thurs. April 13: India — India is experiencing the world's largest democracy. Political, economic and social challenges all place a heavy burden on the government. Pray that the government will choose to build on the progress of recent decades, especially to preserve and protect human dignity, rights, and freedoms. Pray against the increasing re-Hinduization that has emboldened religious violence by racial

Hindu groups and the introduction of many barriers for foreign Christian missions in India.

Fri. April 14: Jordan — Jordan's once-thriving Christian population dropped since 1980, having now Islam (96.5%) as the largest religion. Lower birth rates, Christians who left Jordan and large influx of Muslim refugees all contributed to this change. Pray that all Christians in Jordan (2.2%) will cooperate to make Christ known throughout the society. Pray for a sensitive witness to Muslims and for the protection of converts amid persecution.

Sat. April 15: Northern Cyprus (Turkish Cypriots) — The entire population of roughly 225,000 is Muslim (99.50%) and they maintain strong allegiance to their historic faith which leaves no room for a saviour. Pray that the history of ethnic and cultural prejudice against Christianity will not prevent spiritual openness. Ask God to send labourers to live and work among them and for effectiveness of the Jesus film and radio broadcast to the Turkish Cypriots. Ask God to strengthen, encourage and protect the few Christians (0.50%) and raise a triumphant Turkish Cypriot Church to the glory of His name.

Sun. April 16: Dargin, Ukraine — The Dargin is one of the larger people groups of Southwestern Russia's Caucasus Region. This area is very volatile and violence can erupt at any time. Islam and distrust are two key spiritual impediments for the Dargin people and there is no known Christian among them. Pray for these to change soon and that they fully understand the love of God. Pray that loving and patient Christian workers will reach out to the people in Ukraine and for a spiritual hunger that will drive them to the saving arms of Jesus Christ.

Mon. April 17: Marathi, Zimbabwe — During the days of the British colonization of India, the colonizers sent indentured people of India to serve in Zimbabwe. Among them were the Marathis, who hailed from the state of Maharashtra. Ask God to break the bond of Hinduism as they equate it with their heart culture. Pray that the few followers of Christ among them will exhibit the fruit of the Holy Spirit and draw others to the only Saviour. Ask the Lord to give the Marathi Hindus in Zimbabwe the receptive mind to understand and embrace their need for Christ.

Tues. April 18: Socotran, Yemen — The Socotran of 125,000 people with 0% Christian live on the island located in shark-infested waters between the Horn of Africa and the Arabian Peninsula. The island is largely off limits to outsiders; pray that Christian radio and television would increasingly be available for hungry hearts to listen and view. Pray for a divine move to cause the Socotran families to experience God's blessings. Pray for success on the ongoing Socotran Bible translation and distribution.

Wed. April 19: Banten, Indonesia — Most Banten people make their living as farmers and merchants. Though they are officially Muslim, many participate in the dark arts of the occult. Using Revelation 14:7, pray that the people would fear God and give Him all the glory. Pray that they get the needed training to thrive economically and for spiritual hunger that would lead the people to follow Christ and extend the love to others until there is a church planting movement.

Thurs. April 20: Bederia, Sudan — The Bederia is one of the numerous Baggara tribes of

Northern Sudan. The tribe has about 1.5 million people, living in an area very difficult to access. They have a low literacy rate; pray for Gospel materials in audio form and for the Scripture availability in their own language. Pray that the Bederias would be able to care for their families and for the basic amenities (water supplies, adequate food and housing). Pray for unstoppable and massive movement to Christ among them.

Fri. April 21: Pa-O, Myanmar — The Pa-O people are called Taungthu, which means "hill people," by the Burmese. Their primary religion is Buddhism and only 1.7% of 860,000 people are Christian. Pray the Lord to reveal truth in convincing ways to them. Pray that the few Pa-O believers would grow in the nurture and admonition of the Lord to become testimony of Christ among their own people. Pray for a discipleship making movement that will raise faithful workers to disciple others.

Sat. April 22: Lezgin, Georgia — Lezgin was originally a Turkish term meaning "highland resident." By the 7th century, Islamic power swept into the region and over the past 1000 years exerted huge influence into their society. Thank God for salvation of the few Lezgins outside of Georgia and pray for a Spirit filled indigenous fellowship to show the people the way to the cross. Pray for men and women of peace (Luke 10:6) in each of the over 142 Lezgin towns and villages to be keys to welcoming the love of God into each community in the years ahead.

Sun. April 23: Vai, Liberia — The Vai lives in Northwestern Liberia and Eastern Sierra Leone, West Africa. They are about 193,000 people,

having Islam as the primary religion and 0.7% Christian. Their belief that Jesus is a prophet second to Mohammed makes it difficult to present Jesus Christ as Son of God. Using Daniel 2:47, pray that God will reveal the truth to the Vai leaders and that presenting Christ as a person of power against spirits would open the doors for the Gospel and missionary presence. Ask God to raise strong and viable churches that will plant more churches among them.

Mon. April 24: MSL Kenya — Thank God for the partnering team supporting the office operations. Pray for more partners and staff to join the ministry. It has become necessary for staff to upgrade digitally to impact today's world; pray that they will have the personnel and resources to actualize this. Pray for unity of purpose among the council members and ask God to crown their efforts with success. Pray for fruitfulness in all the fields adopted by the MSL Kenya.

Tues. April 25: MSL United States of America (USA) — Thank God for sustaining the MSL work in USA and ask Him to revitalize the effort and plan to establish new Chapters in Atlanta and Abequeque in New Mexico. Pray that God will raise more committed members to beef up the membership of the current Chapter in the USA and ask Him to bless the members abundantly to support more projects in their adopted field in Cote d'Ivoire among the Djimini People.

Wed. April 26: MSL Nigeria — The MSL Nigeria oversees the MSL operations in other countries. Ask the Lord to enlarge her coast for effective administration and formulation of workable policies that will make operations in the nations more productive with tangible lasting
